(ii) The grant of Rs. 6 lakh was allocated to the Centre under the Research and Teaching Grant. The grant of Rs.50,000/- would be utilized for the purchase of commonly used laboratory items for research. The remaining grant would be utilized equally of the individual faculties of the centre namely, Dr. Rakesh Kumar, Dr. K. K. Haldar, Dr. Rajendra S. Dhayal and Dr. J. N. Babu.

- (iii) The Equipment and Small Equipment Grant amounting to Rs. 25 Lacs and Rs. 10 Lacs were allocated for the Centre. The list of the instruments and equipment's required in the near future for postgraduate practicals and research has been prepared and the necessary purchases would be expedited by Centres purchase committee with prior approval from the competent authority.
- (iv) The committee recommends the procurement of cartridge (1 No.) for the printer issued to the centre for printing official documents. Also, the stationary requirement (within provided budget) of the Centre would be submitted to the Store and Purchase Officer (SPO).
- Item No. 3: The committee recommends for the organization of Lectures from eminent scientist, professors and industrial professionals from various institutions of repute. The list of the speakers would be made and in consultation with authorities, the invited lectures would be organized.
- Item No. 4: There is a need of working/ Laboratory space keeping in the view of the expected purchases for instrument and equipment, besides execution of extramural funded projects by all the faculties (Two DST fast track grants, Three Research Seed Money Projects and One UGC start-up grant), the Centre would be short of space for these activities. Further, a run-up to the next session, new batch of students will join us for the session 2016-17 (August).
