

# 22<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of the Academic Council

12th June 2020

#### RESOLVE:

The members of the Academic Council congratulated the University and NOTED the report of the Vice Chancellor (Annexure-22.2 {Pages 67 to 92}) with appreciation and expressed satisfaction over the progress made by the University.

#### Items for Consideration:

#### Item.No:AC:22:2020:4

To start special scheme for promotion of writing of Research Paper (Specially: Related to Scientific and Technical subject) in Hindi language in Universities The Secretary, AC informed that the University received letter ref. no. 16-1/2018 (Rajbhasha) dated 20<sup>th</sup> December 2019 from the Joint Secretary, University Grants Commission reg. starting of special scheme for promotion of writing of Research Paper in Hindi language in Universities. The letter was placed at Annexure-22.3 (Page - 93).

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The members of Academic Council appreciated the initiative to write Research Paper (Specifically: Related to Scientific and Technically subject) in Hindi language.

#### RESOLVE:

The Academic Council, after detailed discussions, unanimously RESOLVED to recommend to EC to consider the letter of UGC (Annexure-22.3 {Page - 93}) on special planning for promotion to write Research Paper in Hindi language in Universities and further suggested that University should encourage this initiative wherever possible, but this should not be made mandatory.

#### Item.No:AC:22:2020:5

To consider the UGC approved two Credit Courses for awareness about publication ethics and publication misconducts entitle "research and Publication Ethics (RPE)"

The Secretary informed that the University has received a letter from UGC vide D. O. No. F-1-1/2018 (Journal/CARE) which stated that the UGC in its 543<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2019 approved two Credit Courses for awareness about publication ethics and publication misconducts entitled "Research and Publication Ethics (RPE)" to be made compulsory for all Ph.D. students for pre-registration course work. The letter was placed at Annexure – 22.4 {Page 94 to 97}.

In view of the above, UGC directed all Universities

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to ensure the above referred two Credit Courses be made compulsory for all Ph.D. students for preregistration course work.

#### RESOLVE:

After discussion, the Academic Council unanimously RESOLVED to recommend to EC to consider and approve the recommendation of UGC for two Credit Courses for awareness about publication ethics and publication misconducts entitle "Research and Publication Ethics (RPE)" be made compulsory for all Ph.D. students for course work as directed by UGC from Academic Session 2020-21 (Annexure – 22.4 {Page 94 to 97}).

#### Item.No:AC:22:2020:6

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To consider the request of faculty of Computational Sciences to update the Nomenclature from Ph.D. in Computational Sciences to:

- Ph.D. in Theoretical and Computational Chemistry,
- ii) Ph.D. in Bioinformatics, and
- iii) Ph.D. in Computational Physics

The Secretary, AC informed that a request has been received from the faculty of the Department of Computational Sciences to change the nomenclature of the Ph.D. course offered by the department.

Presently, the department is offering Ph.D. in Computational Sciences. As per their request, they have expressed that based on various Institutional scenarios and relevancy in research, the present degree is very much interdisciplinary in nature.

Further, the request also mentioned that during Ph.D. admissions, the department face problem when a student from Computer Science and Technology background apply for Ph.D. in Computational Sciences.

The Secretary further informed that the concerned faculty of department mentioned that this change of nomenclature will improve the job prospects of their departmental Ph.D. students.


In view of the above, the Department of Computational Sciences requested to change the nomenclature of Ph.D. Computational Sciences to:

#### RESOLVE:

The Academic Council after discussion unanimously RESOLVED to recommend it to EC the draft of Sports Policy (Annexure-22.21 {Pages - 277 to 284}) for Students of the University including the 5% supernumerary seats in the Masters' Programme be reserved for Sports Persons and their admission to be governed as per Sports Policy and other eligibility conditions.

The same be implemented from the forthcoming session 2020-21 and be included in Prospectus was also RESOLVED to be recommended to EC.

#### Item.No:AC:22:2020:19

To consider an interdisciplinary course titled 'Parliamentary Procedure and Practices' in the Department of Law

The Secretary informed that in response to the proposal submitted by Department of Law to the Youth Parliament Wing, Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, New Delhi, Prof. Tarun Arora, Associate Dean, Students Welfare, received a letter from the Ministry vide ref. no. 6(4)2018-YP dated 29<sup>th</sup> May 2020 (Annexure-22.22 {Pages 285}) regarding the course on Parliamentary Procedure in India (Virtual or Traditional) for PG level students covering all practical aspects of Parliamentary processes.

The contents of this 2 credit course were discussed in the meeting of the Academic and Administrative Committee (AAC) of the Department of Law, held on 29th May 2020. AAC after adding some topics has recommended this course titled 'Parliamentary Procedure and Practices'.


It has also proposed that this course will be very useful for developing the understanding of the functioning of the Parliament and sensitizing the youth about law making process. CUPB will perhaps be the only university of the nation having introduced this course.


It was further RESOLVED that the recommendations of Curriculum Audit be incorporated, before implementation.

In his request, he stated that about 1000 students have to opt for VACs but in that semester, very limited number of VACs were offered. In those courses, they had limited seats also due to paucity of space here at city campus.

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The Secretary, AC informed that a meeting of faculty members of the Department of Mass Communication & Media Studies and Department of Psychology were held and they had agreed to offer the following 03 VACs:-

- 2. JMC-505: Fake News & Media Literacy.


#### Department of Psychology:

#### RESOLVE:

The Academic Council unanimously RESOLVED to ratify the inclusion of additional Value Added Courses (VACs) (Annexure- 22.35 (Pages 397 to 400)) Offered in January 2020 Semester and recommended to the EC for ratification.

#### Item.No:AC:22:2020:31

To ratify the Credit Transfer and list of MOOC Courses for the students of CUPB in the January 2020 semester. The Secretary, AC informed that the University has received a letter ref. No. 17-03/2019-TEL dated 02-12-2019 from the MHRD regarding Transfer of credits (Annexure-22.36 {Pages 401}). The major highlights of the UGC (Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses through SWAYAM) Regulation, 2016 are as under:

- To widen the access to higher education and bring down its cost by using technological advances, Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) have emerged as a viable model for imparting education, involving conventional and online education and the Indian version of online learning is being launched on an indigenous platform of learning, named as SWAYAM (Study Web of Active Learning by Young and Aspiring Minds)
- These MOOCs apply to the transfer of credits of such students who are enrolled as students in any educational institution in India.
- As per regulation 4(4.2), the MHRD has notified the list of 40 Post Graduate courses for January 2020 semester.
- 4. As per regulation, the university shall, within 4 weeks from the date of notification by SWAYAM, consider through their Competent Authority the online learning courses being offered through the SWAYAM platform; and keeping in view their academic requirements, decide upon the courses which it shall permit for credit transfer. 2 Credit course (30 hrs.)

#### Fees:

#### Faculty:

Interdisciplinary Studies

#### Qualifications of faculty members of the course:

• Ph.D. in relevant subject areas having more than 10 years' of teaching experience

#### About the course

#### Course Code: CPE-RPE

#### Overview

 This course has total 6 units focusing on basics of philosophy of science and ethics, research integrity, publication ethics. Hands-on-sessions are designed to identify research misconduct and predatory publications. Indexing and citation databases, open access publications, research metrics (citations, h-index, Impact Factor, etc.) and plagiarism tools will be introduced in this course.

#### Pedagogy:

• Class room teaching, guest lectures, group discussions, and practical sessions.

#### **Evaluation**

 Continuous assessment will be done through tutorials, assignments, quizzes, and group discussions. Weightage will be given for active participation. Final written examination will be conducted at the end of the course.

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#### **Transportation facility**

For participation in AIU Tournament, university will provide transportation facility to the venue of tournament. If it is not possible to provide transportation then the students will be entitled for transportation fare. The details are:

- **a.** The contingent going to attend/participate to the tournament will be paid second AC/first class rail fare or equivalent to the class entitled for Asstt. Professor for to & fro journey.
- **b.** Local conveyance for moving from university to Railway Station/Bus Stand and from Bus stand/Railway Station to University can be provided if needed.

#### Other support for participation in AIU

- 1. All the students who are members of the contingent visiting tournament will get duty leaves during the period of the tournament.
- 2. Players will get a stipend of 500/- per day for non-playing days and a stipend of 600/- per day on the days of matches.
- 3. All staff members who are the part of contingent will get a stipend of 600/- per day during the period of participation.
- 4. The rates/entitlements shall be reconsidered every three years

#### **Honor of Students**

The students who get a position/prize in their respective games or in team events will be honored by the University. Those who will play in international events representing the country will be given scholarships as per Govt. of India rules. Those who will bring laurels to the country by bringing gold/silver/bronze can be considered for appointment on the campus commensurate to their qualification as per rules.

The students who has represented or won the positions in the International, National, AIU Tournaments, All India Level Tournaments, State Competitions and in the University tournaments (Annual Sports Meet and other tournaments organized by the university during the year.) will get extra marks for best student category as per details mentioned below:

#### **Regarding Examination during the tournaments:**

In case University examination (MST) dates and AIU/National Level Tournaments dates coincide in spite of efforts of the university to avoid clash of dates, special exam could be allowed by the Vice-chancellor for the concerned sports person. Such cases will be brought to the AC for ratification.

#### **Committees**

Three committees will be formed constituting members from both inside and outside Division of Sports. These committees will have specific tasks as mentioned below.

#### 1. Selection Committee

This committee will be responsible for selecting University level team for interuniversity sports events. Following members will constitute the committee,

- 1. Dean Students Welfare: Chairman
- 2. Director Sports or his/her nominee
- 3. HOD of Physical Education
- 4. Coach/ Expert
- 5. Sports Officer: Convenor

#### 2. Grievance and dispute resolution committee

This committee will be responsible for resolving any dispute that occurs during any event related to sports activity. Following members will constitute the committee,

- 1. Dean Students Welfare or his/her nominee
- 2. HOD of Physical Education
- 3. Sports officer
- 4. Department sports coordinator (nominated by Dean, Student Welfare)

#### 3. Pre-Game evaluation Committee

This committee will be responsible for checking candidates for their eligibility and fitness for playing game. Following members will constitute the committee,

- 1. Sports Coordinator
- 2. Doctor
- 3. Physiotherapist

#### **Selection Criteria for University Sports Representation**

The most important attribute for a successful player is their skill and game specific sense. Thus, in the process of selection for representing the University, the athletes are required to prove their potentialities in different Psycho-Physical demands of the game which will be assessed before selection. The students will be required to pass the essential and desirable criteria.

#### Essential criteria:

- 1. Fitness level
- 2. Game specific Ability
- 3. Bonafide student of less than 26 years of age.
- 4. Sportsman spirit

#### Desirable criteria:

- 1. Previous Achievements
- 2. Training Attendance
- 3. Good Knowledge of specific sport and Tactics
- 4. Psychological preparedness
- **5.** Team Spirit

#### **Extramural Competitions**

1. The Extramural sports activities include National University Competitions, Zonal Inter-University Competitions and other allied events.

- 2. The outsource officials for conducting of Extramural sports activities will be provided actual T.A and D.A as per rules
- 3. Flexes and other promotional material will be used during Extramural sports activities.
- 4. CUPB Participants of Extramural sports activities will be provided certificates of participation.
- 5. Required logistics will be hired for smooth conduct of event (Tent age, Sound System, Bedding etc.)

#### **University Fitness Centre**

All students of the university can opt for the facility of fitness Centre but they have to follow the following rules:

- i. Ensure full safety during workouts.
- ii. Avoid over training and workout empty stomach.
- iii. Do workout under the supervision of Instructor.
- iv. Wear easy clothes with sport shoes.
- v. Ask for Exercise Chart and Diet Chart from coach for better workout.
- vi. Follow the time schedule and regular attendance in the Centre.
- vii. Do handle machines and free weight carefully.
- viii. Always carry Centre ID Card with you, entry without ID card is not allowed.
- ix. Be a part to create a healthy atmosphere in the fitness Centre.
- x. The members are advised to bring water bottles and small towels along with them

#### **Don'ts**


