The COC (Chairperson) welcomed all the members to the first meeting of newly constituted Board of Studies vide notification no. 19 reference no.CUPB/CC/15/BOS/Law/19 dated August 4, 2015 and expressed his gratitude for sparing their valuable time to provide a firm footing to the Centre for Law.

These items were approved after the suggested amendments by the Members of the Board of Studies.

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Item No. BOSCL:2:2016:1

Review and updating Course Structure, content of Courses in syllabus and suggested readings of LL.M. 2 Years Programme.

- a. Suggestions to add few more topics in the course of Judicial Process in view of examination pattern of the University.
- b. Review of content of course on Research Method.

After deliberations on the agenda item 1(a), the Board examined the syllabus minutely and after deliberations in detail, following amendments have been suggested in the course structure and scheme:

- i. Landmark judgments under 'Çonstitutional Law' shall be added in Unit III.
- ii. One heading on Recent Judgment shall also be added.

In the Paper on Research Methodology and Legal Writing LSR 501, Unit 2- entry no. 6 Ídentification and formulation of research problem'.

- i. Topic of 'Research Ethics' will substitute Entry 9. Entry 10 will contain Plagiarism in Research'.
- ii. Topic 'Units of Analysis' at Entry No. 7 should be removed.
- iii. Topic of 'Sampling' should be shifted in Unit III under the heading of Techniques of Research Writing.
- iv. Topic of 'Sources of Data Collection' Codification, Analysis and Interpretation should be made separate Entry.

Besides, Dr. Puneet Pathak suggested to reduce the content in the syllabus of Law and Social Transformation. As the content was too heavy. The Board suggested following changes:

- i. Topic of Language and the Law was suggested to be removed.
- ii. Part 2 of Unit first will be shifted to Unit 2nd.
- iii. Only Constitutional guarantees to linguistic minorities will exist out of 2.3 and Non- discrimination on the ground of language will also exist.
- iv. Caste as a divisive factor and other topics except 2 and 4 will exist. Other topics 1, 3 and 5 will be removed.
- v. In unit III, 1st sub topic shall be removed. Rest of the topic will remain as exists.
- vi. In Unit III, 2nd topic Gender Justice and its various forms' under the chapter on Women and Law shall be removed. Additionally, National Commission for Women, Law against sexual harassment was also added. In topic of Empowerment of women, only Constitutional provisions will remain and later part of the content dealing with other provisions' was suggested to be removed.
- vii. In Unit III, few topics covering POSCO and National Commission for Protection of Child, RTE were added under the chapter on Children and the Law and suggested to devise a separate unit Children and Law.

viii. Few Contents of 4th Unit were removed and suggested to shift in the first Unit. Topics of Religions, Languages and Community were to be shifted in one unit.

It was also suggested to add topic in the paper of Applied Legal Studies LSR 555, Law relating to adoption proposed to be substituted by Law relating to Adoption and Maintenance and CARA Guidelines.

Item No. BOSCL:2:2016:2

Review of Interdisciplinary Courses

LSR 507- General Legal Awareness: In 1st unit- Rights of Victim and PIL should be added. In Unit II, RTI and RTS were added. Besides, Entry no. 4 under 2nd Unit- Complaint in Criminal Cases to Police and Magistrates. Topic of 'Bail' suggested to be added. Topics of 'Registration of Marriage should be attached 'Registration of Birth and Death. (Page no. 40)

Item No. BOSCL:2:2016:3

It was suggested to make the contents of Research Method in Pre Ph.D. Course similar.
