Agenda Item 2: Consideration of the course structure for proposed LL.B./B.A.LL.B. Programme to be introduced in the new campus after shifting



To approve the Syllabus of LL.M. 2 Years Programme recommended by BoS

The School Board examined the syllabus minutely and considered the suggestions of Board of Studies in the contents. The members of the Board examined the learning outcomes and transaction mode approved by the Board of Studies and cleared it for presenting to the Academic Council.

The members considered following items:



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Insertion of Learning Outcomes and Transaction Modes of LL.M. Programme

The draft of general learning outcomes and special learning outcomes of LL.M. programme approved by the BoS were presented before the committee and were endorsed.

Insertion of Learning Outcomes and Transaction Modes of Courses: The draft of learning outcomes of various courses prepared by the respective course coordinators duly approved by the BoS were presented to the Members and were endorsed

Restructuring the Course Contents of Research Method of LL.M.

Dr. Deepak Kumar Chauhan proposed some changes for reshaping the content of Research Method course in LL.M. One book authored by V. Tunkel on Legal Research was proposed for addition and endorsed for presenting to the Academic Council for consideration.

Addition of two books in suggested readings of Law and Social Transformation

Two books namely *Law, Development and Socio-Economic Policy* by Patel N. Bimal & Mamata Biswal (2012) & *Law and Good Governance*, Kaur Ranbir, Marwaha Shalini and Singh Devinder (2016) were inserted in suggested readings endorsed for presenting to Academic Council for consideration.

Addition of two books in suggested readings of Legal Theory

Three books namely, *Understanding Jurisprudence* by Raymond Wacks, *Jurisprudence* by J.G.Riddal and *Jurisprudence* by Roscoe Pound were inserted in suggested readings.

Besides, in Unit –II, the concept of ‘constitutional morality’ and in Unit III, the concept of ‘Constitutional Renaissance’ were proposed by Dr. Tarun Arora and endorsed for presenting to the Academic Council for consideration.

Format of Indian Constitution and New Challenges

In the course content of the paper, the alphabet ‘s’ was proposed to be inserted where more than one article of the constitution referred (e.g. Articles- 25-28) and endorsed for presenting to the Academic Council for consideration.

Consideration on LL.M. 581: Theoretical Orientation-I and LL.M. 582: Theoretical Orientation-II courses.

The purpose and pedagogy of the courses spelt out as suggested by BoS along with hours to be devoted to carry out the object of the courses, presented before the School Board and endorsed for presenting to the Academic Council for consideration.

Change in the title of IDS LL.M. 513: Introduction to the Law relating to Child in India.

It was proposed to amend the title of the course from ‘Introduction to the Law relating to Child in India’ to ‘Law concerning Children in India’ and endorsed for presenting to the Academic Council for consideration.


Introduction of Two IDC by Dr. Deepak Kumar

‘Legal Mechanism to control drug abuse’ was added in 4th Unit.
