


Prof. Satish Kapoor, Prof. Ravi Parkash, Prof. A.K. Bhandari, Prof. Nishtha Jaswal and Dr. Felix Bast could not attend the meeting due to prior engagements.

The Chairman and Vice Chancellor, Central University of Punjab extended a warm welcome to the members to the  $18^{\rm th}$  meeting of the Academic Council. He thanked them for sparing their precious time for contributing towards the academic growth of the University.

The Chairman informed the Academic Council members about the sad and untimely demise of Mr. Sushant Sagar, a student of 2<sup>nd</sup> year M.Sc. Biochemistry and Microbial Sciences and Awardee of Vice-Chancellors Best Student, on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2018 night, perhaps due to cardiac arrest. It was also informed that a condolence meet was held on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2018. The condolence message was sent breaved to the family.

The Academic Council observed two minutes of silence to pay respect to the departed soul.

The Chairman then requested the Secretary, AC to present the Agenda Items one by one for deliberations and decisions/recommendations. The Secretary presented the Items in sequence.



#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:1

To confirm the minutes of the 17<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2018. The Secretary, AC informed that the draft minutes of the  $17^{th}$  meeting of Academic Council, held on  $31^{st}$  January 2018, were circulated to all the members of the Council on  $22^{nd}$  February 2018.

A few minor corrections as suggested by the members were incorporated in the minutes and the final minutes were circulated on  $27^{th}$  March 2018.

The members were requested to confirm the minutes of the 18<sup>th</sup> meeting.

#### **RESOLVE:**

The Academic Council unanimously RESOLVED to confirm the minutes of the 17<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2018.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:2

To consider the Action Taken Report (ATR) on the decisions of 17<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council. The Secretary, AC informed that the 17<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council was held on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2018.

It was further informed that the decisions taken by the Academic Council in its 17<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved by the Executive Council in its 28<sup>th</sup> meeting vide Item.No:EC:28:2018:4 to Item.No:EC:28:2018:29.

Subsequent to the circulation of final minutes, the concerned Centres/officers/ officials implemented the decisions taken by the Academic Council in its  $17^{\rm th}$  Meeting.

The details of the actions taken were presented to Academic Council as placed at *Annexure-18.1 {Pages 30 to 40}.* 

#### **RESOLVE:**

The Academic Council NOTED the Action Taken Report on the decisions of the 17<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Council and expressed its appreciation.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:3

To consider report on the progress of the University by the Vice Chancellor.

The Vice Chancellor presented his report in the form of a presentation briefing the Council about the progress of the University, after the last meeting of the Academic Council, held on 31st January 2018.

The members were informed that for admission to various programmes, CUCET was conducted on  $28^{th}$  - $29^{th}$  April 2018. The demand ratio for PG programme has been 1:69 and for Ph.D. programme it is 1:73. The online counselling for admission is in process and progressing well.

The other information included status of cumulative student strength *vis-à-vis* previous years, filled positions (both teaching and non-teaching) w.r.t. total sanctioned positions, research projects at CUPB and academic collaborations with other research and educational institutions.

The Chairman also informed that two Professors have joined the post of Chair Professors; Prof. Kuldeep Singh under Baba Sh. Satguru Ram Singh Chair and Dr. Harpal Singh Pannu under Sh. Guru Gobind Singh Chair

The members were informed that the University has over 165 Research Projects of worth more than Rs 57 Cr.

It was added that following major project have been recently sanctioned – MoFPI Project proposal worth of Rs. 5.15 crores; NMHS (MoEF & CC) coordinated Project on Himalayas- Rs. 4.68 Cr; DST-FIST (Human Genetics and Molecular Medicine) – Rs.97 lacs; Under "Pandit Madam Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMT &T)" – School of Education (Dept of Education)- Rs. 4.86 Cr; Teaching- Learning Centres (TLC), Dept of Sociology)- Rs.96 lacs; CSIR, Dr. Vikas Jaitak, Deptt of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Natural products- Rs. 29.5 lacs; ICSSR, Dr. Pany, Dept. of Education- Rs 8 lacs; ICSSR, Dr. Semedha Dutta Dept. of Sociology- Rs. 7 lacs.

The Chairman informed that CUPB is the first Central University to have adopted National Academic Depository (NAD).

While detailing the academic collaborations with Research and Educational Institution, the Chairman informed that the University has signed MoU/MoAs with the University of Lille, France.

**Prof. Ravi Prakash**, Professor, Department of Genetics, MDU, Rohtak delivered lecture on "Impact of Global Climate Warming on Animal Ecology and Human Health" on 5<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

Prof. Balwan Gautam, (Professor, Ambedkar Chair, CU Himachal Pradesh) delivered a lecture on 'Life and Mission of



Dr. B.R. Ambedkar' on 14th April, 2018 as a part of 127th birth anniversary celebrations of Baba Saheb Dr. B.R Ambedkar. A Quiz Competition for school students was also organized by the University

Prof. V.S. Chauhan (Padam Shree Awardee), Former Chairman, UGC, Chairman Executive Committee, NAAC, delivered a lecture on "Challenges in basic to Translational Research" on 19th March 2018.

**Dr. Rekha Bharadwaj**, Former Registrar, DAV University Jalandhar, delivered a lecture on "Quality Enhancement in Higher Education System" on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2018.

The Chief Guest Shri Jitendra Sharma, IFS, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Punjab, delivered the keynote address on "Biodiversity Day" on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2018 to 24<sup>th</sup> May 2018.

As a preparation for Celebrating the **World Environment Day-**June 5, the University, in collaboration with the District Admin., Forest Department and State Pollution Control Board organized lectures on the declared theme of the year - Beat Plastic Pollution on 1st June 2018. The Deputy Commissioner and ADC, Forest Officer and progressive farmers of Bathinda attended the event. Those farmers (over 150) who did not burn their crop stubbles were honored with Commendation Certificate by the District Administration.

As per the directives of Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, National Youth Parliament was organized on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2018. S. Raj Dev Singh Khalsa, Former M.P. Sangrur and Sh. Rajan, Under Secretary, Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, were the Jury members.

To commemorate 'World Health Day' on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2018, a Health Camp was organised by Community Development Cell, NSS and Vardaan Club in association with Bathinda Cycle Club for elderly people (age above 50). About 90 volunteers were registered for various test such as blood pressure, blood sugar and other vitals.

The Chairman also informed that **Mr. Gaurav Joshi**, a student of the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences & Natural Products has been honored with Sun Pharma Science Scholar Award comprising cash prize of Rs. 50,000/- and Citation. He is the only CU student from amongst senior scientists, Directors Professors, Teachers and Scholars from IITs and recognized Science Labs to receive the award.

It was also informed that Prof. P. Ramarao, DAA has been

bestowed with Dr. K.M. Parikh Award during international Conference on "Challenges for Global Competitiveness of AYUSH and Natural Products" held on  $2^{nd}$  February 2018 at Delhi Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research University (DPSRU).

The University celebrated its 9<sup>th</sup> Foundation Day on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018 after a long week celebrations. **Prof. Ashok Sahni**, INSA Senior Scientist and Professor Emeritus, Panjab University, Chandigarh was the Chief Guest on the occasion and delivered Foundation Day address. **Prof. S.S. Johl**, Hon'ble Chancellor graced the occasion with his presence.

On the occasion of  $9^{th}$  Foundation Day, the University bestowed awards to its best teachers, best students and best non-teaching staff.

The presentation concluded with explaining the status of construction works ongoing at the Main Campus of the University. It was also informed that the University is expecting to shift to the Main Campus sometimes by the end of the year.

The detailed presentation is placed at <u>Annexure-18.2</u> {Pages 41 to 66}.

#### RESOLVE:

The Academic Council NOTED the report of the Vice Chancellor (Annexure-18.2 {Pages 41 to 66} with appreciation and expressed satisfaction over the progress made by the University after its 17th meeting held on 31st January 2018.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:4

To consider (a) continuation of Ph.D. Programme along with government job in respect of Ph.D. Scholars of the University. and (b) make recommendations for declaring zero semester on account of valid reasons.

The Secretary, AC informed that a Committee was constituted to consider continuation of Ph.D. Programme along with government job in respect of Ph.D. Scholars of the University. Its recommendations were presented as placed at <u>Annexure-18.3</u> {Pages 67 to 68}.

In addition to the already adopted rules and regulations for Ph.D. programme, the Committee recommended following additional guidelines w.r.t. continuation of remaining Ph.D. Programme with Govt. job:

i. The student shall have to submit the copy of his/her appointment letter with the application.

- ii. The student shall have to seek concurrence or NOC from his/her employer.
- iii. The student shall have to deposit requisite fee for each semester till submission of the Thesis.
  - iv. The student shall have to be eligible to avail of all the facilities like Library, Computer Centre and Labs as applicable to the regular students.
  - v. The student shall have to complete the Programme as per UGC Regulations in force.

The Secretary informed that the Committee also recommended following additional guidelines w.r.t. declaring zero semester due to health condition, fellowship abroad or other similar valid reasons during Ph.D programme.

- i. As per request of the student for declaring zero Semester due to health condition, fellowship abroad or other similar valid reasons, his semester may be declared as zero semester.
- ii. No fee will be charged during zero semester.
- iii. Total duration (excluding the zero semester) shall be as per UGC Regulations.
- iv. The student will have to submit the application in advance for seeking permission of declaring zero semester.
- v. She/He will not be entitled to any facility during zero Semester.
- vi. She/He will not be entitled to seek take the guidance from the Supervisor during zero Semester.
- vii. To continue further, the students will have to reregister herself/himself on completion of zero semester.
- viii. Not less than one and not more than two semesters shall be considered for declaring as zero semester.

It was also informed that the Executive Council considered the same in its 29th meeting held on 7th May 2018 vide Item.No:EC:29:2018:18 and in anticipation of the recommendations of the Academic Council, resolved to approve the continuation of Ph.D. programme along with government job in respect of Ph.D. scholars of the University, as proposed by the committee, with additional clause that no fellowship be paid during the zero period.

The Academic Council after deliberations unanimously


- a) Following additional guidelines, in addition to already adopted rules, for continuation of Ph.D. programme along with government job in respect of Ph.D. Scholars:
  - i. The student shall have to submit a copy of his/her appointment letter.
  - ii. The student shall have to seek concurrence or NOC from his/her employer.
  - iii. The student shall have to deposit requisite fee for each semester till submission of the thesis.
  - iv. The student shall avail all the facilities like Library, Computer Centre and Labs as applicable to the regular students.
- b) Following additional guidelines for availing zero semester due to health condition, fellowship abroad or other similar valid reasons during Ph.D.:
  - i. As per request of the student for availing zero Semester due to health condition, fellowship abroad or other similar valid reasons, his semester may be declared as zero semester.
  - ii. No fee will be charged for zero semester.
  - iii. Total duration (excluding the zero semester) shall be as per UGC Regulations.
  - iv. The student will have to submit the application at least one month in advance for availing zero semester.
  - v. She/He will not be entitled for any facility during zero semester.
  - vi. She/He will not be entitled to take the guidance from her/his Supervisor during zero semester, as a matter of right.
  - vii. To continue further, the students will have to reactivate her/his registration on completion of zero semester.
  - viii.Not less than one and not more than two semesters shall be considered for declaring as zero semester.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:5

To consider and review the decision take by the

The Secretary, AC informed that the University from beginning was following the procedure that the Ph.D. thesis



EC in its 21st meeting vide Item.No: EC:21:2016:11 regarding evaluation of Ph.D. Thesis by at least two experts. shall be examined by three external examiners, out of which one has to be from abroad.

Later, Executive Council in its 21<sup>st</sup> meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> June 2016 vide Item No. EC:21:2016:11 resolved to adopt the provision of UGC Regulations, 2009 in which the thesis produced by the M.Phil./Ph.D. students shall be evaluated by at least two experts, out of which at least one shall be from outside the state.

Later, the Examinations Section requested that the evaluation of thesis from three examiners/experts is better in regard to evaluation and have a broader view in judging the thesis work submitted by the students of Ph.D.

It was also suggested that in case of negative report from any one examiner, the Examination Section will send the case to the Vice-Chancellor for consideration by the Committee consisting of:-

- a) Dean Academic Affairs Chairman
- b) Registrar
- c) Controller of Examinations
- d) Dean of the School
- e) Head of Department
- f) Supervisor of the candidate.

It was further informed that the Executive Council considered the same in its 29th meeting held on 7th May 2018 vide Item.No:EC:29:2018:19 and resolved that the item be referred back to the Academic Council with a recommendation that the earlier decision of evaluation of Ph.D. thesis by two experts be continued to avoid delays and in conformity with UGC Regulations.

#### RESOLVE:

The Academic Council considered the proposed review of earlier decision of 21st Executive Council regarding evaluation of Ph.D. thesis by atleast two experts, as per UGC Regulations 2009/2016 and RESOLVED to maintain the *status quo*.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:6

To consider extension of Rules for Ph.D.
Programme (applicable w.e.f. Session 2017-18) to the Session 2016-17.

The Secretary, AC informed that the University has adopted the UGC (Minimum Standards & Procedure for Awards of M.Phil/Ph.D. Degree), Regulations, 2016 vide Item.No.EC:25:2017:22 applicable w.e.f session 2017-18.



Since, the UGC Regulations, 2016 are applicable to the Ph.D. students w.e.f. 2016-17, it has to be adopted for batch admitted in academic session 2016-17 also.

It was further informed that the Executive Council considered the same in its 29<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2018 vide Item.No:EC:29:2018:20, in anticipation of AC approval, and resolved to extend the rules for Ph.D. Programme (based on UGC Regulations, 2016) applicable w.c.f. session 2017-18 for session 2016-17 also.

#### **RESOLVE:**

The Academic Council, after deliberations, unanimously RESOLVED to ratify the decision of Executive Council for *post facto* adoption of the rules for Ph.D. Programme (based on UGC Regulations, 2016) to the students of the batch admitted in 2016-17 also, to continue with Research Advisory Committee and defining of Credit System.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:7

To Note the approval of UGC for establishing Department of Hindi at CUPB.

The Secretary, AC informed that the University had sent a proposal to the UGC for establishing a Department of Hindi vide letter dated 9<sup>th</sup> February 2015 (*Annexure-18.4* {*Pages 69 to 79*}).

The UGC vide its letter no. 43-12/2017(KVV) dated 29<sup>th</sup> March 2018 (Annexure-18.5 (Pages 80 to 81)) has sanctioned 07 posts i.e. 01 Professor, 02 Associate Professor and 04 Assistant Professor, and an amount of Rs. 1.14 Crore for establishing the Department of Hindi at the University.

It was further informed that the University is already offering M.A. Hindi and Ph.D. Hindi programmes under Department of Languages and Comparative Literature. The syllabi of these courses were approved by the 17th Academic Council and 28th Executive Council meetings (Copies placed on table). It is proposed that these courses may be shifted from the Department of Languages and Comparative Literature to the newly established Department of Hindi.

Further, there is one Assistant Professor Dr. Rajinder Kumar in the Department of Languages and Comparative Literature who is teaching both M.A. Hindi and Ph.D. Hindi programmes. To facilitate the smooth functioning of the new Department and running of the said courses, the Assistant Professor may also be shifted to the new Department of Hindi.

The Executive Council considered the same in its  $29^{th}$  meeting held on  $7^{th}$  May 2018 vide Item.No:EC:29:2018:21 and in anticipation of the recommendations of AC, resolved to approve:-

a) Establishment of the Department of Hindi at University;

b) Shifting of M.A. Hindi and Ph.D. Hindi programmes already running under Department of Languages and Comparative Literature to the Department of Hindi;

c) Shifting of services of Dr. Rajinder Kumar, Assistant Professor from Department of Languages and Comparative Literature to the Department of Hindi. He shall vacate the post held by him in the Department of Languages and Comparative Literature, but retain his services and related benefits including pay, as such.

#### RESOLVE:

The Academic Council, after deliberations, unanimously RESOLVED to ratify the following resolve of the Executive Council:

a) Establishment of the Department of Hindi at University;

b) Shifting of M.A. Hindi and Ph.D. Hindi programmes already running under Department of Languages and Comparative Literature to the Department of Hindi;

The Academic Council FURTHER RATIFIED the shifting of services of Dr. Rajinder Kumar, Assistant Professor from Department of Languages and Comparative Literature to the Department of Hindi. He shall vacate the post held by him in the Department of Languages and Comparative Literature, but retain his services and related benefits including pay, as such.

The Academic Council suggested that the name of Department of Languages and Comparative Literature be re-considered in view of one of the languages (Hindi) being separated from it to a new Department.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:8

To consider implementation of projects at Department of Languages and Comparative Literature, Central University of Punjab, Bathinda under

The Secretary, AC informed that the faculty of Department of Languages and Comparative Literature submitted a proposal for financial assistance to the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sanasthan to start a project under "Ashtaadashi" (18 Projects) for sustaining growth of Sanskrit in 2016. The Department received approval of the project in December 2017. Vide this project Sanskrit will be taught to the desirous students in the evening



"Ashtaadashi"(18 Projects) for sustaining the growth of Sanskrit for the year 2016-17. on the campus.

It was informed that the University has no Evening School running at present, a Standing Committee comprising the following was constituted to review the projects to be submitted to funding agencies:

- 1. Dean Academic Affairs
- 2. Registrar
- 3. Dean Student Welfare
- 4. Proposers
- 5. Assistant Registrar (Finance) Convener

Further, a meeting of the Standing Committee for review of project proposals was held on 12<sup>th</sup> February 2018. The committee discussed the proposal of Evening School Project submitted by Dr. Zameerpal Kaur and Dr. Rajinder Kumar of Department of Language and Comparative Literature. The committee was of the opinion that starting of evening school is a policy decision and should have concurrence of Statutory Bodies before it is started. Hence committee recommended that the project may be put for consideration of Academic Council and Executive Council.

The Secretary also informed that the Executive Council considered the same in its 29th meeting held on 7th May 2018 vide Item.No:EC:29:2018:22 and resolved to approve starting of Evening School under project, subject to recommendations of the Academic Council, at no cost to the University except the logistic support.

#### **RESOLVE:**

The Academic Council, after deliberations, unanimously RESOLVED to ratify the decision of to the Executive Council to approve in principle the starting of Evening classes under the project as stated above.

The Academic Council FURTHER RESOLVED that the University may start the Evening classes only after detailed deliberations on syllabus and others details of the proposed project and the details be brought back to the Academic Council for consideration.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:9

To consider the starting of an elective course related to "Swachcha"

The Secretary, AC informed that the UGC letter No. F.No.9-10/2018(CPP-II) dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2018, has approved to provide two credits (like any other "Elective" course) under



Bharat Abhiyan" activities under CBCS from the forthcoming summer session.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) to students in higher Educational Institutions undertaking 15 days (100 hours) Summer Internship under Swachcha Bharat Abhiyan Activities.

The Academic and Advisory Committee comprising of all Deans and Associate Deans deliberated on the letter. Its recommendations are at *Annexure-18.6 {Pages 82 to 83}*.

It was informed that the Executive Council considered the same in its 29th meeting held on 7th May 2018 vide Item.No:EC:29:2018:22 and resolved to approve the starting of an elective courses related to Swachcha Bharat Abhiyan activities under CBCS from the current summer session, subject to recommendation of the Academic Council.

It is for information of AC that the University has started the elective courses related to Swachcha Bharat Abhiyan activities under CBCS from May-June 2018.

#### **RESOLVE:**

The Academic Council after deliberations, unanimously RESOLVED and to ratify the decision of the Executive Council the starting of an elective course related to Swachcha Bharat Abhiyan activities under CBCS, from the current summer session, as per letter dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2018 of UGC. (Annexure-18.6 (Pages 82 to 83)).

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:10

To consider revised proforma for "application form" for promotion under CAS and Annual Self-Assessment for Performance Based Appraisal System. (PBAS).

The Secretary, AC informed that the Executive Council in its 20<sup>th</sup> meeting vide item.No.EC:20:20:2016:7 had approved to adopt the PBAS proformas as adopted by Panjab University Chandigarh and the same was implemented by the University.



- c) The Departments should encourage Project Reports of limited scope in PG programme, keeping in mind the fund restraints and availability of chemicals and equipments.
- d) In addition to introducing basic research through a project review, last semester may be used to supplement the NET syllabus preparations mock tests/rehearsal tests etc.
- e) The Electives must be offered in every semester and in each semester there should be enough (at least 2) options for the students to choose from.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:22

To consider policy for the signing of MoU/MoAS by the University. The Secretary, AC informed that the University receives several requests from the educational and other institutions for entering into MoUs for academic/research exchange and cooperation.



At present the University is following two types of MoUs:

- a) Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Universities/Institution of national importance
- b) Memorandum of Academic Support (MoAS) with reputed colleges of the region.

In principle MoU with only registered/accredited bodies is allowed.

The Secretary presented the relevant Ordinance of 'Recognition by the University for Cooperation/Collaboration with other University/Authority/Institution' from UGC Model Ordinances for the Central Universities as placed at <u>Annexure-18.10</u> {Pages 146 to 148}


The minutes of IQAC were presented as placed at <u>Annexure-18.12</u> [Pages 150 to 154] for consideration.

To meet the requirements of NAAC, University has to have a very active Placement Cell for retaining its NAAC accreditation as well as for better NIRF rating in the coming years.

It was felt that there is a need to have a Placement Cell with members who have active interaction with the industry, R&D institutions, etc. the places where the students can get employment/internship/industrial trainings. Keeping the same in view, the following committee was constituted:

The analytical facilities of Central Instrumentation Laboratory (CIL) have been made open on 4<sup>th</sup> January 2018 to the outside and in-house users on chargeable basis and till the end of January 2018, a total of 876 samples including 480 on DNA sequencer have been analyzed using the Hiend Analytical Equipment.

The IQAC while appreciating the opening of CIL services to outside and in-house users on payment basis, resolved that CIL will communicate to the Vice Chancellor, Deans, Registrars, Faculty, Researchers etc. of the various academic, R&D and industrial houses about the services of CIL, CUPB being offered



on chargeable basis through mail. CIL will also share the list of parameters along with the testing charges with the said groups/institutions.

The IQAC desired that the Curriculum prepared in the light of these guidelines be put into practice from the ensuing academic session i.e. 2018-19 and in the light of the same, the schedule of meetings of various committees for the approval of the same was deliberated and approved as below:

#### 2. Placement Cell:

As approved by IQAC in its 9th Meeting, the Placement Committee including a Placement Officer (a consultant could be hired to head the Placement Committee) and five students members nominated by the students' body of the University is proposed for approval by IQAC.

It was also recommended that IQAC may:

1. Empower the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to nominate one of the faculty member or some consultant into the field of the placement of the students from the University as Chairperson of the Placement Committee of CUPB.

2. Keep a record of the students who qualify CSIR/UGC/ICMR/ICAR Fellowship exams and join Ph.D. Since the mandate of the University is to train young minds towards creation of new knowledge through research.

#### IQAC recommended that:

1. The nomenclature of Placement Cell be changed to Placement Training Cell.

2. Dr. Raj Kumar was nominated as Coordinator of Placement Training Committee to head the committee.

3. After admission of new batch, two students from the new batch will be nominated by Students Council. The other student members who are nominated are:

The Academic Council FURTHER RESOLVED that the change of nomenclature will be from prospective and not retrospective effect as per decision of 28th Executive Council.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:31

To re-consider the Professional Leave to faculty for attending Refresher/Orientation Courses The Secretary, AC informed that the University did not have vacations for faculty till December 2017. The teachers had to take their Earned Leaves to attend Refresher/Orientation Courses which are mandatory for their respective promotions.

Later, in order to facilitate their professional growth the University, as recommended by Academic Council in its  $5^{th}$  meeting held on  $15^{th}$  November 2014, the Professional Leave for attending these courses was approved by the Executive Council in its  $11^{th}$  meeting held on  $25^{th}$  November 2014.

Based on referendum and as per the demand of the majority of faculty members and in the light of UGC Regulations, the University had to switch over from non-vacational to vacational institution as approved by the Executive Council in its 26<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> September 2017 vide Item.No.EC:26:2017:14.

The UGC Regulations, do not provide for Professional Leave. Further, now since the University has become vacational institution, therefore, the provision of Professional Leave, as approved by 26<sup>th</sup> EC, needs to be stopped. However, the other General Rules relating to leave of other type as approved by 26<sup>th</sup> EC will remain intact as mentioned in University Notification dated 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2014 *Annexure-18.17 {Page 180}.* 

The Secretary added that as IIGC vide its letter dated  $4^{th}$  June 2018 has conveyed that period for which a regular teacher participates in Refresher Courses/Orientation Programme will be treated as On Duty.

#### **RESOLVE:**

The Academic Council, after deliberations, unanimously RESOLVED to recommend to the Executive Council to:

- a) Retain the general rules of leaves and dispense with the provision of Professional leave, and
- b) The regular teachers participating in Refresher Courses/Orientation Programme be treated as 'On Duty' and not on 'Duty Leave', as per UGC letter.

#### Item.No:AC:18:2018:32

To note seats in various courses for session 2018-19. The Secretary, AC informed that the Executive Council in its 28<sup>th</sup> meeting vide Item.No:EC:28:2018:29 considered and resolved to approve the recommendations of the 17<sup>th</sup>Academic Council to increase the number of seats of courses offered by the University for the Academic Session 2018-19.

It was further informed that an internal committee was constituted for implementation of the matter regarding number of seats for Masters Programme (Session 2018-19) as per the approval of AC/EC.

The committee was of the opinion that the number of seats for Masters Programmes (Session 2018-19) may remain same as in previous Session i.e. 2017-18 due to strong apprehension that the University may not get the control of the constructed buildings/class rooms before the start of new Session. It was felt that the University will not be in position to shift to the new campus before starting of new session i.e. 2018-19.

The Secretary added that the committee recommended that

number of seats in Masters Programme should remain same as per last year i.e. Session 2017-18. It requested the Vice-Chancellor, being the Chairman of the Academic Council and Executive Council, to approve the following in anticipation of approval from the AC/EC:-

- 1. Revised number of seats for Masters Programme (Session 2018-19) may remain same as in last session i.e. 2017-18.
- 2. Prospectus for Masters Programme (Session 2018-19) which has been uploaded on the University website after due approval from the AC/EC may be removed with immediate effect and Prospectus with revised seats may be uploaded on the University website.
- 3. Revised seats may be forwarded to the CUCET Head Quarters for notification on the CUCET website.
- 4. The Registrar, Prof. S.S. Marwaha and Dean Students Welfare are to explore the possibility of hiring hostel accommodation near University campus. They can opt any additional members also.
- 5. Hostel rooms will be allotted as per merits.
- 6. Each Department will be allotted with Hostel Seats in proportion to the admissions as per the strength.
- 7. For time being, accommodation will be allotted for Ph.D. Scholars/Project JRF, SRF etc, subject to the availability of seats after allotting to the M.A./M.Sc. students, as the Ph.D. students are entitled to HRA.

The 29<sup>th</sup> Executive Council vide Item.No:EC:29:2018:2 resolved to approve, in view of the acute space shortage, the recommendations of the Committee constituted to re-look into the space availability and keeping the seats in Masters Programme for Λcademic Soccion 2018-19 same as in session 2017-18.

The Secretary also informed that the HoD, Department of Pharmaceutical & Natural Products has conveyed to the Examinations Section that Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) has given approved intake of 15 seats each in M. Pharm. (Medicinal Chemistry) and M. Pharm. (Pharmacognosy & Phytochemistry) for year 2018-19 (total 30 seats). Further he has requested that the preference need to be given to GPAT qualified students.

The University had offered 24 and 18 seats for M. Pharm. (Medical Chemistry) and M. Pharm. (Pharmacognosy & Phytochemistry) respectively for Academic Session 2018-19. It has, however, been mentioned in the prospectus that the seats may vary after the PCI/AICTE extension of approval (2018-19).



#### RESOLVE:

The Academic Council, after discussion resolved to ratify:

- 1. Retaining the no. of seats in Masters Programme for Academic Session 2018-19 same as in session 2017-18, due to acute shortage of space.
- 2. The intake of 15 seats each in M.Pharm. (Medicinal Chemistry) and M.Pharm. (Pharmacognosy & Phytochemistry) for year 2018-19, as per the approval of Pharmacy Council of India (PCI).

To fix the date of the next meeting of the Academic Council.

The Academic Council authorized the Chairman to plan the next meeting of AC, as per need.

#### Agenda:

Continuation of remaining Ph.D. Programme along with Govt. job in respect of Ph.D. Scholars of the University for placing the same before the AC/EC for reconsideration.

The Committee has gone through the decision of the 14th AC vide Item No. AC:14:2017:7 and 24th EC vide Item No. EC:24:2017:29 regarding continuation of Ph.D. Programme along with Govt. job in respect of Ph.D. Scholars of the University.

- 2. As per above mentioned approval of the AC/EC, these are the following guidelines in respect of continuation of remaining Ph.D. Programme along with Govt. job:
  - a. As per UGC regulations Ph.D. programme will be of minimum three years.
  - b. In order to avail leave from CUPB during Ph.D. programme, a student must have completed four semesters at CUPB and also must have completed course work for the degree.
  - c. There should be a special reason such as a job, fellowship abroad, health condition or other similar valid reasons for taking leave/zero semester.
  - d. The period of absence from CUPB shall be treated as zero semester and shall not add to maximum prescribed period for completion of degree.
  - e. Hostel shall be vacated during zero semester.
  - f. No fee will be charged during zero semester.
  - g. g. After availing leave period, student will return to CUPB, register for the semester and continue till completion of degree.
- 3. The Committee discussed the matter in detail and accordingly recommended that the above guidelines may be substituted with the following:-

These guidelines may be made for following two purposes:-

- (a) Request by the student for continuation of remaining Ph.D. Programme with Govt. job.
- (b) Request by the student for declaring zero Semester due to health condition, fellowship abroad or other similar valid reasons during Ph.D.

As regards point (a) above, following points may be considered:- in clubing point (b) of Porce

- As per UGC Regulations, Ph.D. Programme will be of minimum three years. (i)
- The student shall have to submit the copy of Appointment Letter. (ii)
- The student shall have to seek concurrence or NOC from the employer. (iii)
- The student shall have to deposit fee for each Semester till submission of Thesis. (iv)
- The student shall have to be eligible to avail all the facility like Library, Computer (V). Centre. Labs etc. as applicable to regular students.
- The student shall have to take the guidance from the Supervisor. (vi)
- The student shall have to complete the Programme as per UGC Regulations. (vii)

As regards point (b) above, following are recommended:-

- As per request of the student for declaring zero Semester due to health condition, fellowship abroad of other similar valid reasons, his Semester may be declared as zero Semester.
- No fee will be charged during zero Semester. (ii)
- Total duration shall be as per UGC Regulations. (iii)
- (iv) The student will have to submit the application one month advance for declaring zero er substicion Semester.
  - He will not be entitled for any facility during zero Semester.
- (vi) He will not take the guidance from the Supervisor during zero Semester.
  - To continuo further, the students should have to register himself on completion of zero (vii) Semester.

(viii) Maximum two Semesters shall be considered for zero Semester.

तुलनात्मक साहित्य केंद्र के अतंर्गत स्नातकोत्तर और शोध कार्यक्रम संचालित किए जा रहे हैं। इनके पाठ्यक्रमों में हिंदी भाषा एवं साहित्य का बखूबी समावेश किया गया है। जबकि पंजाबी भाषा, साहित्य एवं संस्कृति केंद्र में वर्तमान में केवल स्नातकोत्तर कार्यक्रम का संचालन किया जा रहा है।

इसी कड़ी में विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग के निर्देशानुसार पंजाब केन्द्रीय विश्वविद्यालय हिंदी भाषा और साहित्य का संरक्षण एवं संवर्द्धन करने के उद्देश्य से हिंदी विभाग की स्थापना करने की दिशा में प्रयत्नशील है।

विश्वविद्यालय में हिंदी विभाग स्थापित करने का उद्देश्य हिंदी के विद्यार्थियों एवं शोधार्थियों को हिंदी भाषा एवं साहित्य के शिक्षण एवं पठन-पाठन की व्यवस्था प्रदान करते हुए अतंर्राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर हिंदी भाषा की बढ़ती आवश्यकताओं की पूर्ती करने के योग्य बनाना है।

हिंदी भाषा में संचार व अतंर अनुशासनिक शोध को ध्यान रखते हुए अनुवाद, जनसंचार, पर्यावरण एवं साहित्य, रचनात्मकता और नवाचार को शामिल करते हुए हिंदी के कार्यक्षेत्र का विस्तार करना भी प्रस्तावित हिंदी विभाग का महत्त्वपूर्ण कार्य होगा।

# विश्वविद्यालय की मुख्य उपलब्धियां

2008—2009 में स्थापित सभी केन्द्रीय विश्वविद्यालयों और भारतीय प्रौद्योगिकी संस्थानों में पंजाब केन्द्रीय विश्वविद्यालय ने एक उत्कृष्ट स्थान प्राप्त किया है। 29 जनवरी 2014 को रिसर्च गेट स्कोर, साइटेशन इंडेक्स और एच—इंडेक्स में प्रथम रैंक प्राप्त किया।

विश्वविद्यालय ने एग.एस.सी. भौतिकी (नैनो—फिजिक्स), एम.एस.सी. आण्विक आनुवंशिकी, एम.फिल. भौतिकी, एम.टेक. साइबर सुरक्षा और एम.ए. (ऑनर्स) पंजाबी एवं तुलनात्मक साहित्य सरीखे नए स्नातकोत्तर शैक्षणिक कार्यक्रमों को शामिल किया है।

विश्वविद्यालय वर्तमान में अपने 10 स्कूलों और 16 अध्ययन केन्द्रों में 20 कार्यक्रम संचालित कर रहा है। वर्ष 2013–14 में प्रवेश परीक्षा में सम्मिलित होने वाले विद्यार्थियों की संख्या बढ़ कर 1650 हो गई। विश्वविद्यालय में देश के 18 राज्यों एवं संघ शासित प्रदेशों के विद्यार्थी अध्ययनरत हैं।

2013—2014 में अध्ययन कक्ष, भंडारागार, संकाय केबिन, पोर्टा केबिन, पादप ऊतक संवर्द्धन प्रयोगशाला, जैनसूचना विज्ञान प्रयोगशाला और भौतिकी प्रयोगशालाओं को वर्तमान अवसंरचना में जोड़ा गया है। इस वर्ष प्रयोगशालाओं में नए उपकरण जैसे कि एच1 मोनोक्रोमेटिक माइक्रोप्लेट रीडर, वर्टीकल ऑटोक्लेव और बाईनोकुलर रिसर्च माइक्रोस्कोप, फ्रेंक हर्ट्ज़ एक्सपेरिमेंट सेटअप, मिल्लिकन'ज़ ऑयल ड्रॉप सेटअप, डाईलेक्ट्रिक कांस्टेंट सेटअप, हिस्टैरिसीस लूप ट्रेसर, ऍफ.ई.एस.ई.एम., सीएलएसएम इत्यादि खरीदे गए हैं।

ज्ञानार्जन के लिए उचित माहौल प्रदान करने के लिए विश्वविद्यालय पुस्तकालय द्वारा गुणवत्तापूर्ण शोधपत्रिकाएं एवं शोधपत्र तथा पुस्तकों उपलब्ध करवाई जा रही है। पुस्तकालय में पुस्तकों की संख्या 14, 220 से बढ़कर 17,454 तथा ऑनलाइन शोधपत्रिकाएं 9,100 से बढ़कर लगभग 9,336 हो गई हैं। राष्ट्रीय एवं अंतर्राष्ट्रीय मुद्रित शोधपत्रिकाओं की संख्या 85 से बढ़कर 90 हो गई हैं। नए अध्ययन डेस्क और फर्नीचर में वृद्धि करते हुए 100 अन्य पाठकों के बैठने की क्षमता विकसित की गई है।

कंप्यूटर केन्द्र में 30 एप्पल आईमैक्स से से एक अलग नवीन मैकिनटोश अनुभाग स्थापित किया गया है। कंप्यूटर केन्द्र में कंप्यूटरों की कुल संख्या 200 हो गई है। विद्यार्थियों को अपनी निजी पुस्तकों एवं वाई—फाई से अपने लैपटॉप पर इंटरनेट का प्रयोग करने के लिए एक नया वातानुकूलित वाचनालय भी स्थापित किया गया है।

उच्च—स्तरीय अनुसन्धान, अकादिमक कार्यक्रम और संकाय एवं विद्यार्थी विनिमय में सहयोग को बढ़ावा देने के लिए विश्वविद्यालय ने पंजाब कृषि विश्वविद्यालय, लुधियाना, बाबा फरीद स्वास्थ्य विज्ञान विश्वविद्यालय, फरीदकोट तथा नेशनल अकैडमी ऑफ मेडिकल साइंसेज, नई दिल्ली जैसे प्रतिष्ठित संस्थानों के साथ समझौता—ज्ञापन पर हस्ताक्षर किए हैं।

पूर्व कुलपित प्रोफ़ेसर (डॉ.) जै रूप सिंह ने अपने पांच वर्षों का कार्यकाल 3 मार्च 2014 को पूर्ण किया। प्रोफ़ेसर (डॉ.) आर के. कोहली ने नए कुलपित के पद पर 5 सितंबर 2014 को कार्यग्रहण किया। नए कुलपित के कार्यग्रहण के साथ ही घुद्दा गांव में 500 एकड़ के एक विशाल भू—भाग पर स्थापित होने वाले मुख्य परिसर के विकास कार्य ने गित पकड़ी। नए परिसर की मास्टर योजना और वास्तु डिजाईन के लिए वास्तुकार नियुक्त कर लिया गया है। भारत सरकार के एक उपक्रम मैसर्स इंजीनियर्स इंडिया लिमिटेड इसके परियोजना अनुवीक्षण सलाहकार हों होंगे। अनुमोदन भवन परामर्शक समिति से अनुमोदन के उपरांत मास्टर योजना को पंजाब नगर विकास प्राधिकरण द्वारा अनुमोदन किया गया।

मुख्य परिसर की चारदीवारी और सड़कों का निर्माण हो चुका है। निर्माण कार्य चरणबद्ध तरीके से किया जाएगा। प्रथम चरण की निर्माण गतिविधियों में निर्मित किए जाने वाले प्रमुख भवन खंड नीचे दिए गए हैं:

- 1. अकादिमक खंड
- 2. 'बालक' और 'बालिका' छात्रावास
- 3. कैफेटेरिया और भोजनालय
- 4. अध्यापकों एवं कर्मचारियों के लिए आवास
- 5. अतिथि गृह
- 6. वाणिज्यिक क्षेत्र

आशा है कि बहुत जल्द नए परिसर का नींव पत्थर रखा जाएगा और आने वाले 12–15 महीनों में विश्वविद्यालय नए परिसर में स्थानांतरित हो जाएगा।



<u>Item No. AAC:01:2018:1</u> – To Consideration of starting an elective courses related to <u>Swachcha</u> Bharat Abhiyan activities under CBSC from the forthcoming summer session.

As per Letter vide No. F.No.9-10/2018(CPP-II) dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2018, University Grants Commission has approved in its 530<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 20.03.2018 to provide two credits like any other "Elective" under Choice Based Credit System (CBSC) to students in higher Educational Institutions undertaking 15 days (100 hours) Summer Internship under Swachcha Bharat Abhiyan Activities. In the summer internship the students will not only participate in the overall cleanliness in the villages/slums but would also help in setting up systems for sustaining cleanliness/sanitation efforts under Swachcha Bharat Abhiyan. They requested to consider providing an "elective course" under CBSC with two credits for 15 days (100 hours) Summer Internship under Swachcha Bharat Abhiyan activities in the University and give wide publicity among the students so that vast majority of the students opt for this elective course.

The Committee deliberated on the issue in detail and it was resolved that a Committee comprising of the following members may be constituted for development of curriculum for this elective course and for implementation in the Central University of Punjab, Bathinda. The Committee will submit Curriculum for this elective subject on or before 04.05.2018.



## Department of Chemical Sciences

The committee discussed and unanimously resolved:

Agenda Item No. 1: The chairperson proposed the M.Sc. Chemistry syllabus for 2018-19 batch onwards. The chairperson further summarized the minor changes being proposed in the existing syllabus, however he emphasized that there are minor structural changes in the proposed M.Sc. Chemistry syllabi. During the deliberations there was observed an anomaly in terms of splitting of the project in two semesters and that credits of the seminar are not evaluated for awarding grades.

Program and it is a significant component of the total credits there should be a proper evaluation of credits in such a manner that the grade is awarded and accordingly the same should be included in the CGPA. - Skill based elective courses (14 Cr.) were kept in Semester-II and Semester IV. These include: Credit Seminar-I (1 Cr.), Project Work (12 Cr.) and Credit Seminar-II (Presentation Skills; 1 Cr.).
- A 4 credit elective MOOC course has been added in Semester-IV.
- Elective Foundation/Value based courses (1 Cr. each) were introduced in Semester-II and Semester-III.
- Total credit for Project Work has now been reduced from 20 Cr. to 12 Cr. in Sem-IV.
- DEC-I and DEC-II courses (2 Cr. Each) are included in semester- III and IV. DE is to enrich student domain/knowledge which will help them in employment.
- The curriculum has been designed by keeping in view of the syllabi of Institutes/Universities of National and International repute and may be utilized for various competitive exams as well as it will enhance employability of the students in academia as well as industry.

Item No. 2: To discuss about complete/partial adoption of PCI recommended curriculum, syllabi and examination pattern for M.Pharm. courses.

Resolution: IOAC of CUPB issued the guidelines (Annexure-I) for masters' programs and recommended that those courses which are being regulated by National Regulatory Bodies need to follow their guidelines and requirements w.r.t curriculum and credits. M.Pharm. programs are being regulated at National level by Pharmacy Council of India (PCI). PCI has recommended curriculum, credits, course codes, examination/evaluation pattern for M.Pharm. courses (Annexure II) vide Gazette of India No. 362, dated June 1, 2017. PCI through notification Ref no. 14-136/2016-PCI/13921-15179 (Annexure III ) instructed all the universities and colleges to comply with the prescribed curriculum, credits, course codes, syllabi and examination/evaluation pattern for M.Pharm. courses failing which approval of the courses may be cancelled. Further, committee went through the syllabi of M. Pharm courses run by some institutions such as UIPS, Panjab University, Chandigarh, Delhi Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research University (DPSRU) Delhi, Guru Nanak Dev University (GNDU), Maharaja Ranjit Singh Punjab Technical University (MRSPTU) and found that these institutions were the curriculum, credits, course codes, following examination/evaluation pattern for M.Pharm. courses 100% as prescribed by PCI. The committee was informed about the recent PCI inspection held for the approval of M.Pharm. courses in Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy and Phytochemistry. The PCI final decision on the approved intake is under process. Keeping in view of the above, committee recommends that curriculum, credits, course codes, syllabi and examination/evaluation pattern may be adopted as such prescribed by PCI for M.Pharm. courses (copy enclosed, Annexure IV) w.e.f batch 2018-19 onwards. However apart from PCI compliance, few additional courses pertaining to Pharma Industry perspectives may be introduced so as to

expose students to current trends in research and development of pharmaceuticals.

The suggested courses are as under:

- 1. Pharmacological screening and Regulatory toxicology of 4 credits to be offered in Semester-III.

- 3. Another ID course, 2-credits related to Safety (Chemical, Biological and Radiation) to be offered in Semester II and the course content may be adopted from NIPER, SAS Nagar.



#### Agenda 8/2017/2: Action taken on decision of the Previous Meeting of IQAC

Members, while taking note of the action taken on various items recommended the following additions/supplementations. The agenda wise changes/additions/supplementations and the resolutions thereafter on the agenda items of the 7<sup>th</sup> meeting are as follows:

• Agenda 6/2017/9-Innovation and Best Practices: The members were apprised of the status of the undertakings provided by the various centres that they are taking care of the course contents of various papers that they are aligned to NET syllabus. It was resolved that

Soft reminder shall be sent to the CoCs who have yet not provided the undertakings to the IQAC office w.r.t. the alignment of the course contents with NET syllabus of the programmes being run under their centres.

The members were informed that after the letter from IQAC, all the Departments except the three Departments namely: **Department of Law, Economic Studies and Sociology** have informed that their course contents are aligned with the NET syllabi. The Committee took a note of the same and ask IQAC to provide the requisite information by 29<sup>th</sup> December 2017. In case, they fail to do so the matter should be reported to the Competent Authority for initiating action against the concerned Department.

IQAC was asked to take steps to ensure that all the Departments submit the information regarding the status of upgradation/restructuring of the curriculum after approval from the respective BOS. In case, they fail to do so the matter should be reported to the Competent Authority for initiating action against the concerned Department.

Also, the information from them has been sought regarding what could be the perspective industry for their placements, summer trainings/internship, etc. The information thus sought from the various departments as well as the relevant information of the other institutions have been used to develop the procedure and rules & regulations for the placement cell of the University.

Dr. Marwaha informed the members that Mr. Nitin Singal of Indotech Engineering Products - member of IQAC, while conveying his inability to attend the meeting because of other exigencies, informed that he has gone through the draft guidelines and rules & regulations for the Placement Cell. Mr. Nitin further brought out that the committee constituted for the purpose has done a good job as the most of the requirements for the establishment and operation of the Placement Cell have been included in the draft guidelines.

Dr. Marwaha also informed the committee that Mr. Nitin has offered his services for the placement of the students of various programmes being run by the University. The members appreciated the comments and offer of Mr. Nitin on the draft guidelines of the Placement Cell and his offer for helping the University for the placement of the students.

The guidelines and rules & regulations prepared by the committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. (Mrs.) S. K. Bawa constituted in the 8<sup>th</sup> meeting of IQAC were looked into by the members of the IQAC. The members of the IQAC, while giving its approval of the guidelines in general recommended to include the following:

1. Placement Cell with Prof. (Mrs.) S. K. Bawa as Chairperson constituted in the last meeting is to facilitate the Placement Committee being setup. A Placement Committee shall comprise of a Placement Officer (a consultant could be hired to head the Placement Committee) and five students members nominated by the students' body of the

University for the placement of students from professional courses. The Placement Committee shall also make efforts for the placement of students of other streams being run in the University. Of the five (05) nominated student members, two (02) students will be from the outgoing batch and two (2) students from the first year of the professional PG programmes. The fifth nominee (01) student shall be nominated by the University Authorities i.e. Dean Students Welfare.

- 2. Students who register for placement will have to pay non-refundable fee of Rs.500/-.
- 3. Financial matters w.r.t. the placement of the students are to be managed by the Placement Committee.
- 4. Placement Cell shall take feedback from the companies who come for the placement of the students to prepare the students for their campus placement in future.

#### Further, after deliberations, the committee resolved that

- 1. University will create a Placement Cell Account with a seed money of Rs.2.5 lacs from the student's fund of the University. Also, University will financially support the Placement Cell with an amount of Rs.2 lac per year upto the fifth year after its establishment. Thereafter, the financial status of the Placement Cell shall be reviewed by the members of the Placement Cell in terms of whether the financial support needs to be continued or not. If it is to be continued, the Placement Cell will recommend to the Competent Authority of the University to continue the same w.r.t. how much and for how long, the financial support is required.
- 2. The Placement Cell constituted with Prof. S. K. Bawa as member, including members from Departments running professional courses shall continue to exist and assess/review the guidelines, rules & regulations and the performance of the Placement Committee from time to time and will update/amend the rules & regulations if required.

The suggestions of the members of the IQAC in the document of guidelines and rules and regulations for Placement Cell are incorporated and the amended document is placed at *Appendix-I*.

#### Guidelines for Curriculum Design and Development

#### **Masters Programmes**

- 1. The University is following Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in all its Master Programmes. All Programmes consist of at least 90 credits (except M.Tech., M.Ed. and M. Pharma.) The credit and other requirements for these professional programmes are determined as per requirements of respective National Regulatory Bodies.
- 2. The courses in the programmes are distributed into core, elective and foundation courses according to CBCS. The elective courses are further classified into Discipline specific, skill based and interdisciplinary courses. Foundation courses include compulsory foundation and elective foundation. However, it is mandatory to have Value Added Courses, MOOC, Discipline Enrichment courses, Project Work/Dissertation & Seminar in the programme.

#### 2.1 Core courses:

A course, which is compulsorily, be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

#### 2.2 Elective Course:

A course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.3 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:

Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

2.4 Interdisciplinary Elective:

The discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

2.5 Foundation Course:

There are two types of foundation courses: Compulsory foundation and Elective foundation. Compulsory foundation are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement and are mandatory for all disciplines. Elective foundation are value added courses.

#### 2.6 Dissertation/Project:

An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

#### 2.7 Skill Enhancement and Value added courses:

These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The list of Value added courses is attached (Annexure 1).

#### 2.8 MOOC courses:

MOOC course of 2 to 4 credits in each semester under discipline elective or compulsory foundation course may be offered to the student in a programme from the list provided by swayam to the Head of the concerned Department. These credits will be included in the total requirement of 90 credits of a programme. However, the student is required to submit the pass certificate of MOOC course before the declaration of result.

- 2.9 **Discipline Enrichment Courses**: These courses deal with the specific content to compete for National level competitive examinations. Such two courses are to be offered in the fourth semester to focus on practical orientation through exercises.
- 3. The Curriculum Development Committee (CDC) of each department shall design and prepare curriculum. After recommendation by AAC, the respective Board of Studies, School Boards and Statutory Bodies of the university will approve it.
- 4. The following template is given as a guideline to prepare the course structure of any programme in the following areas of study.

5. The process of designing and developing curriculum is as given below:

#### 5.1 Need Assessment

- a) The feedback on curriculum (semester wise) from students, stakeholders & faculty members is to be analyzed and considered for updating the curriculum. The feedback proforma is attached. (Annexure II to IV).
- b) Top 100 universities at global level, top 10 universities at national level, guidelines of UGC NET and other statutory bodies are to be explored for the new changes/updating the curriculum.

#### 5.2 Curriculum Development Committee (CDC)

The Curriculum Development Committee of every department will design and develop the course structure. The course includes learning outcomes, content, instructional strategies/transactional mode, evaluation criteria & suggested readings. The following points are to be considered by CDC:

- a) Learning outcome of the course should match the content.
- b) The credit hours are to be distributed among four units for 15 weeks per semester as per the university calendar.
- c) The credits per semester should not exceed 26.
- d) The modules in each unit are to be evenly distributed.

- e) The content distribution in each module should be from simple to complex and from conceptual to application oriented.
- f) The credit distribution to the following courses will be as given below:

- g) The instructional designs/transactional modes are to be proposed keeping in mind their appropriateness with the modules.
- h) The suggested readings are to be updated every year.
- i) Objective Evaluation criteria for field trip/visit/internship/industrial visits are to be mentioned in the curriculum.
- j) Question bank for each course is to be prepared based on credits of the course and have to be submitted for End Term Evaluation.
- k) The number of questions will be calculated by the formula given below:

- 6. The evaluation of dissertation/project shall be done as per clause 18 of EC and no marks shall be awarded. For uniformity, evaluation of the dissertation/projects shall be carried on as given below:
  - 6.1 The final result of the project/dissertation will be on 5 point scale and evaluated as Excellent, Very Good, Good, Average and Unsatisfactory, which will be mentioned on the mark sheet/transcript but not be counted towards overall Grade Point Average.
  - 6.2 The supervisor shall ensure the submission of synopsis of the dissertation/project to the Dean of respective discipline through Head of the Department before start of the second MST of third semester. The duration of progress presentations of every student will be for half an hour in every semester. The project work/Dissertation will be submitted before start of the end

- semester examination of fourth semester. The dissertation will be evaluated by external expert through presentation by 30th May. Three members will evaluate the project work: Dean/Dean's nominee, HOD and supervisor before the end semester examination.
- 6.3 The title of dissertation/project, once decided shall ordinarily remain unchanged during the whole programme. However, the Dean of the concerned School on the recommendation of Head of Department and Supervisor of the student may permit modification in the topic, if considered necessary. Major changes can be made in the title only after the approval by the Dean Academic Affairs on the recommendation of the committee comprising of Dean, HOD and Supervisor of the concerned student.
- 7. For the purpose of preparing time table, the credits hours are to be distributed as given below:
  - 1 credit = 1 theory period of one hour
  - 1credit = 1 tutorial period of one hour
  - 1credit = 1 practical period of two hours
  - 7.1 If a theory or practical is shared among faculty members, it is to be ensured that it reflects in the timetable credit wise and accordingly the load is to be calculated.
- 8. The university may plan the number of seats per elective paper as per the facility and infrastructure available.
- 9. The course having practical component will not have tutorial.
- 10. Coding of the courses is as per the university code structure issued by Controller of Examination. The coding of Course Structures will be rechecked by the office of Controller of Examination.
- 11. Remedial classes may be arranged, if required.

ANNEXURE-18.17

In pursuance to Item No. EC:11:2014:13 of the Minutes of the 11<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Executive Council of Central University of Punjab, approval of the Executive Council is hereby conveyed to the recommendations of the Academic Council (as recommended in its 5<sup>th</sup> meeting) for grant of Professional Leave in favour of the faculty members to attend orientation/refresher course(s) as detailed below:

1) General Rules Relating to Leave:

- a. No teacher can claim leave as a matter of right and when the exigencies or service so demand, leave of any description may be refused or revoked by the leave sanctioning authority.
- b. In case a teacher is recalled to duty before the expiry of his leave, such recall to duty shall be treated as binding and compulsory in all cases.
- c. Except as otherwise provided in these rules, leave shall be earned by period spent on duty only.
- d. No teacher shall avail leave of any kind, except in case of emergency or for reasons beyond his/her control, unless the leave has been sanctioned by the competent authority. Provided further that application for leave must reach the competent authority in advance giving sufficient time to grant or deny the leave.
- e. As a general rule, the Professional leave can be availed from the commencement of the academic session and no teacher would be permitted to proceed on long leave while the academic session is in progress and continuing.

2) Professional Leave:

- a) A whole time permanent teacher may be granted Professional Leave of such duration as may be considered necessary by the canctioning authority for career progression as per UGC guidelines.
  - 1. Attending the orientation/Refreshers' Course of the national level bodies on behalf of the University or with the permission of the University.
- b) Professional Leave may be granted on full pay without any other financial compensation.
- c) Professional Leave will not be combined with any other leave except medical leave.
