Minutes of the meeting of the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of Executive Council held on October 20, 2009 held at City Campus

The Vice Chancellor (Chairperson) welcomed the hon'ble members to the first meeting of the Executive Council. He thanked them for sparing their valuable time from their busy schedules and for travelling all the way to Bathinda to participate in the meeting.

Item No. EC:1:2009:1

#### Report on the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor

The Vice-Chancellor briefed the Members of the Council about the progress of the University since his joining as Vice- Chancellor on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2009. A power-point presentation (**Annexure I**) showing step-by-step evolution of the university was presented to the Council. The Members were informed about:

- (i) The land acquired by the Punjab Govt. for the University at Village Ghudha, near Bathinda. Over 500 acres have been acquired out of which the University would get 500 acres.
- (ii) The additional land is being acquired by Govt. to provide direct independent access from the main road to university site, which was not there earlier; and also about shifting of the road that was bifurcating the university, to the outside boundary of university.
- (iii) Setting up of the Camp office at Vice Chancellor's residence
- (iv) Setting up of the Transit Campus at BACOSPIN (taken on lease for 5 years).

The Members of the Council were also informed that CPWD constructed the camp office and that CPWD has also been entrusted with the repair and renovations of the Transit (City) Campus as well as for undertaking topographical survey and installing boundary pillars at the main campus. The details about the appointments made and other decisions that had been taken in anticipation of the Executive Council approval were discussed.

The Members of the Council while complimenting the Vice-Chancellor for the excellent progress that has been made despite severe handicaps, unanimously approved the above decisions taken by the Vice Chancellor (Annexure II).

Item No. EC:1:2009:2

#### To consider amendment to Statute 11 of the University Act

The Council resolved to adopt the amendment to Statute 11 of the University Act as per **Annexure III** and recommended that the same be sent to MHRD along with the explanatory note for Visitor's approval.

Item No. EC:1:2009:3

#### To consider Schools and Centres of Studies proposed as per Annexure IV.

The Council considered the Schools and Centres of Studies being proposed as **per Annexure IV** The Council resolved that a Committee be constituted under the Chairmanship of Professor Powar to draft the Statute that may be placed before the Academic Council and the same be put up to the Executive Council for ratification and further submission for Visitor's approval.

#### To consider adoption of new Pension Scheme

The Council resolved to approve the adoption of new Pension Scheme operationalized by the Govt. of India vide MHRD circular No. D.No.F.19-15/2004-IFD (Vol III) dated August 21, 2009.

Item No. EC:1:2009:5

#### To consider taking over new areas on lease from BACOSPIN

The Council observed that the location of the Transit Campus is very ideal and the available structures and area have the potential to absorb the expansion of the university for many years. The efforts that have been made to transform it into a Transit Campus would be more purposefully utilized if it is developed into a proper City Campus of the University on a permanent basis.

After discussions, the Council resolved that the University should take on lease, on existing terms and conditions, the entire 35 acre area of the BACOSPIN where Transit Campus is located so as to develop it into a proper City Campus.

The Council further resolved that, the University should endeavour to out rightly purchase the whole 35 acre area or take it on very long term lease basis.

#### To consider nominations to various bodies/committees

## After thorough deliberations on nominations to the various Committees, the Council resolved as under:

- a. Professor H.P Dikshit be nominated from the Council as Member of the Finance Committee. The Executive Council authorised the Vice-Chancellor to nominate other 2 members.
- b. Dr. Ch. Venkateswara Rao, Controller of Examinations, University of Hyderabad, be nominated as member of the Selection Committee for selecting the Controller of Examination. The Council authorised the Vice-Chancellor to nominate other two members on its behalf.
- c. Dr. Jagdish Arora, Director, INFLIBINET, Ahmedabad be nominated as a member of the Selection Committee for selecting the Librarian. The Council authorised the Vice-Chancellor to nominate the other two members on its behalf.
- d. The Council authorised the Vice-Chancellor to nominate three persons, not in the service of the University, out of the panel of names that may be recommended by the Academic Council for selecting the Professors.
- e. The Council authorised the Vice-Chancellor to nominate two persons, not in the service of the University, out of the panel of names that may be recommended by the Academic Council for selecting Associate/Assistant Professors.

Item No. EC:1:2009:7

### To consider travel by any airline other than Air India flights

The Council resolved that in special cases officials coming to University meetings be reimbursed travel by any airline suitable and accessible to them.

The Council further observed that Bathinda is very poorly connected by train to Delhi & other parts of India and to travel by air one has to either go to Amritsar or to Chandigarh, and it is not feasible to take Air India flights without spending one additional travel day on each side. Therefore, it was resolved that a special request be made to MHRD for getting permission for Vice-Chancellor and officials to travel by any airline between Amritsar/Chandigarh - Delhi – Amritsar/Chandigarh sector.

# To consider adoption of open application system based on IIT pattern to fill up various contractual and regular positions

After detailed discussions over the type of response being received for various contractual and regular positions the Council resolved that the University should adopt an open application pattern to fill up all the positions on the pattern being followed by some IITs. The Council felt that this would facilitate submission of applications by the applicants at any time and would also attract a wider range of suitable candidates.

#### Any other item:

#### After detailed discussions the Council resolved that:

- a. A Master Plan for the main Campus be prepared.
- b. As soon as the land of the main campus is transferred to the University, it should be ensured that the land is also mutated on the name of Central University of Punjab.
- c. Archiving of the whole data regarding the University should be initiated from the beginning itself.
- d. The medical insurance of all employees instead of medical reimbursement be explored.
- e. RITES and other similar agencies be approached for undertaking construction work of the main campus of University.
- f. A Planning Board be constituted for the University.
- g. All future construction assignments given to CPWD or other agencies should include a penalty clause to cover completion delays.

# To consider holding the next meeting of the Executive Council either at Delhi or at Chandigarh

In view of the difficulties being faced by the Members of the Council to reach Bathinda, the Council resolved to explore the possibilities of holding the next meeting of the Council either at Delhi or Chandigarh.

Note: The University after discussing the issues with MHRD and UGC formally requested the State Government on 5th May 2009 for getting the premises of the closed spinning mill on lease basis. It also requested the UGC on 21st May 2009 for permission for getting this site repaired and renovated to run the transit campus. The approval of the State Govt. was accorded on 23rd June 2009. While the "in principal" approval of UGC was received only on 7th July 2009. The MoU was signed on 8th July 2009.

d) Installation of two units of (5 Kilo Watt each) Solar Wind Energy Hybrid Systems by PEDA at a cost of Rs. 8,05,000/- at the City Campus

#### Explanatory Note: Amendment Proposed to Statute 11 (under Section 27(2) of the Act)

- As per the provisions laid down under Statute 11 of the Central Universities Act (2009), the meeting of the Executive Council of the Central University of Punjab, Bathinda is ordained to have 7 (Seven) member quorum out of the total 11 (Eleven) members nominated by the Central Government for authenticating its proceedings.
- As the Executive Council of Central University of Punjab comprises a galaxy of multi-locational academic luminaries and distinguished persons, it may not be feasible to meet the statutory obligation of seven member quorum out of the 11 (Eleven) members nominated by the Govt. of India.
- With the express purpose of making the functioning of the Executive Council more effective and practicable, the following amendment is proposed.
