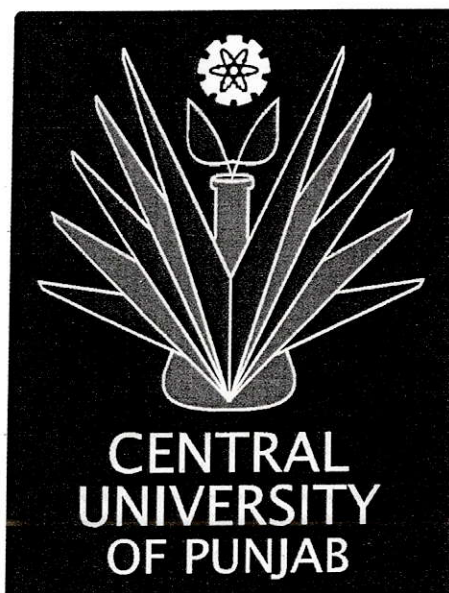

Welcome Note of the Vice Chancellor

The Vice Chancellor welcomed the members of the Executive Council to the Thirteenth meeting. He thanked them for sparing their valuable time from their busy schedule to participate and to guide the university in making appropriate decisions.

(A) For Consideration

While presenting this item, the Vice Chancellor stated that in the last meeting of Executive Council (vide item EC:12:2014:1 dated 9.12.2014), the Council had authorised the Vice-chancellor to look into and to check some of the appointments of non-teaching staff made between 12.10.2013 till the next meeting of Council i.e. 22.8.2014.

The Vice Chancellor informed the members that as desired by the Council in its last meeting, he had gone through the details of appointments of Drivers, Deputy Registrar and UDC.

His observations were placed on the table before the Council for its consideration.

He further informed that as per the records available, he investigated the appointments of Drivers but did not find any procedural irregularity in these appointments. He also told the members that irrespective of any consideration, both the drivers are

punctual, sensible, careful and safe drivers and they bear good conduct.

Great deal of discussion was focused on the procedure and eligibility of the candidates for the posts of Deputy Registrar and one of the UDC.

However, incidentally, answers to the following could not be found out from the records available with the university:

- i. Why the variations in minimum and desirable qualification/eligibility criteria were made for these positions advertised at different points of time. For instance, in case of Deputy Registrar **(a)** the elimination of requirement of Ph.D. from *Desirable qualification* in the advertisement Nos. NT-02/2009 dt. 4.8.2009 and NT-07/2010 dt. 3.4.2010. **(b)** why was the grade pay specified in advt. No. NT-01(2013) dt. 2.2.2013 and NT-08 (2013) dt. 11.10.2013, but not in NT-06 (2011) dt. 30.5.2011. **(c)** why the previous advertisements were not closed before advertising the new one, if the essential and desirable qualifications were to be changed (with or without explicit justification). It was argued that candidates eligible in response to 1st, 2nd and 3rd time advertisement, may not be eligible in all the three. In case all the three advertisements were to be simultaneously followed, the candidates called for interview must be eligible in response to each of the three advertisements. This amounts to enhancing the validity of the advertisements, *post facto* i.e. not during the validity period but after the last date to apply was over. **(d)** why grade pay (which was a point of eligibility condition) of the person selected not verified. Likewise, the experience (which was also a point of eligibility condition) not verified. Instead the statement of the candidate was relied upon, inspite of lack of any supporting document.

The Vice Chancellor stated that the office has been trying to trace out the records relevant to the

selections, as desired earlier by the EC members. However, some of the records still wanted are not available. On this members expressed serious concern. The members were apprehensive that official record is the property of the university and it should be well maintained under the supervision of the office of the Registrar – the custodian or whosoever is entrusted to do the same. They were expected to do their duty with full dedication. If they did not, this is purely a dereliction of duty.

The members desired the VC to seek explanation from the employee(s) who were present at that time, and also were supposed to be the custodian of the record and are directly affected on account of the absence of the documents/records.

The members also requested the Vice Chancellor to take strict action, if any irregularity is found in maintenance of official records by the concerned office/officer/official.

The members discussed these appointments in details and desired some more information. The members ultimately requested the Vice Chancellor to look into these matters and to check these appointments w.r.t. the above said points and bring further information collected in the next meeting.

After great deal of discussion the decision on the item was **deferred** to the next meeting for the want of documents for seeking clarity on the appointments of especially Deputy Registrar and UDC.

Item No. EC:13:2015:2C

To consider the grant of telephone allowance to the Teaching and Non-teaching staff of the university

The Vice Chancellor informed the Council that vide Item No. EC.11.2014.10 on recommendations of Finance Committee of CUPB vide No. Item No. FC:6:2014:14:14.1 had approved the grant of telephone allowance to the Non-teaching staff of the university w.e.f. 1st December 2014 as per Government of India Notification No. 7 (14)/C&V/2006 dated November 14, 2006:

On the recommendations of the Finance Committee meeting dated 12.11.2011 item 5 (item No. FC:3:2011:5) the Executive Council vide EC:6:2012:12:7 dated 25.3.2012 had allowed reimbursement of the telephone bills upto Rs. 500/-, Rs. 750 and Rs. 1000/- per months to the Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors respectively as one of the incentives for faculty to promote Extra Mural Research and to attract good teachers.

He stated that as per Sr. No. 3 in the table, telephone allowance is restricted to 25% of Group 'A' officers below the rank of Deputy Secretary with GP Rs. 5,400/- and above. Out of the sanctioned posts of Group A (non-teaching) in the University, four posts are filled – One Dy. Registrar, two Assistant Registrars and one System Analyst.

Explaining agenda item it was brought to the notice of the EC members that the teaching faculty (Assistant Professors) of the university jointly submitted a representation for enhancement of the telephone allowance from Rs. 500/- to Rs. 800/- per month in view of their seniority as per Gol orders No. 7(14)/C&V/2006 dt 10.4.2007 as their grade pay is higher than 5400/-

Annexure-1

The Council considered and after discussion, it was unanimously **RESOLVED** that the university should follow the prescribed rules for reimbursement of the telephone allowance to non-teaching staff strictly as per the of Government of India rules. This be not treated as allowance.

The Council also considered the representation of the faculty (Assistant Professor) for enhancement of telephone allowance from Rs. 500/- to Rs. 800/-. However, it was not approved as the previous Executive Council had approved it as an incentive not as an allowance in order to promote Extra Mural Research by the faculty and to meet faculty crunch by attracting good faculty and to retain the present one.

It was **FURTHER RESOLVED** that status-quo with regard to the reimbursement of telephone charges be maintained in case of Assistant Professors/Faculty. For non-teaching staff the resolve of the last meeting be implemented.

Other Items:-
Current Agenda

Item No. EC:13:2015:3C

To consider the Cadre Recruitment Rules (CRR) for non-teaching positions.

The Vice Chancellor informed the Council that in view of the UGC letter No. F-63-1/2010 (CU) dated 19.11.2014, the university has drafted the Cadre Recruitment Rules (CRR) for its staff as per the format and guidelines of Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT). An internal Committee constituted for the proposed drafted these Cadre Recruitment Rules keeping in mind the requirements of the posts, commensurate to education standards, experience and maturity needed in selected incumbent as also the qualifications - essential and desired, and the age limits prescribed in the CRRs of central universities namely CU Rajasthan, CU Tamilnadu, CU Himachal Pradesh, and SLIET Langowal – a MHRD institution in the region.

The Vice Chancellor also brought to the notice of the EC that Dr. K.K. Bajaj had also been assigned the task of framing the eligibility conditions. His recommendations are awaited. Since there is an urgency in recruiting the staff he requested for discussing the recommendations of the committee under reference. It was agreed to. The recommendations with respect to the each point were thoroughly discussed.

Annexure-2

After discussions, it was **RESOLVED** to:

a. Segregate the posts which are covered by the

UGC regulations and adopt them without any changes.

- b. Further **RESOLVED** to accept the recommendations of the committee for the positions of non-teaching staff with Grade pay 5400 or less. i.e. from Sr. No. 8 onwards. Still further it **RESOLVED** that suggestions, if any, received from Dr. K.K. Bajaj be incorporated if felt justified by the Vice Chancellor.

Item No.EC:13:2015:4C

To consider the recruitment of following teaching and non-teaching positions on contractual/ deputation basis to be advertised by the university, if approved:

While presenting the item the Vice Chancellor explained the urgent need (technical grounds in case of faculty for the following teaching positions in view of the on-going/planned courses:

- Centre for Environmental Law: Associate Professor/Professor – 2 positions as per UGC guidelines.
- Centre for Economic Studies: Assistant Professors/Professor – 2 positions because of severe paucity of faculty.
- Centre for Education: Professors (2 Nos.) as per NCTE norms

The Council was also apprised of the urgent need of staff on the following non-teaching positions:

a. Technical:

- Data Entry Operators -2 (for day to day work)
- Executive Engineer (on deputation) for New Campus
- Consultant – Landscaping for the new campus.

b. Non-technical: (on deputation or contract including superannuated)

- Non-Technical: Officer on Special Duty
- Liaison Officer
- Consultant (Landscaping and miscellaneous (2 Nos.)

The Council considered the requirement of each position and present work load with the various university departments and **RESOLVED** to approve recruitment of above teaching and non-teaching

positions on contractual basis on consolidated salary or as per rules. In case of deputation or superannuation on the salary as per Govt. norms. For appointments on regular basis be done after following established government procedures was further resolved.

Item No. EC:13:2015:5C

To consider the recommendations of Building Advisory Committee and prepare for start of construction of the new campus.

The recommendations of the Building Advisory were placed on table and the Vice Chancellor informed the Council that in its meeting held on 10th January 2015, the Building Advisory Committee took important decisions related to preparations for the start of construction at the new campus.

After thorough discussions and utilizing the experience and expertise of Er. S.L. Garg an Hon'ble member of EC, it was suggested that care be taken that the university through BAC has the overriding powers in terms of a) time schedule/line b) quality of material and construction and c) fiscal aspects including payments.

Since valid agreement between university and the EIL has already been entered into, care be taken while floating the tender. This be conveyed to the BAC was also suggested. This was agreed to.

The members perused the minutes of the BAC and **RESOLVED** unanimously to approved them.

EC also **RESLOVED** to approve the list of newspapers for insertion of Advt. inviting tenders for construction.

Item No. EC:13:2015:6C

To consider the celebrations of Foundation Day of the university.

The Vice Chancellor informed the House that National Science Day i.e. **February 28, 2015** happens to be the Foundation Day of the university. On this day, a befitting Foundation Week culminating into Foundation Day function is proposed to be organized on the campus. For this event all the members of Statutory Committees of the university will be cordially invited.

It is proposed to invite the Visitor, Hon'ble President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee as Chief

Guest Madam Smriti Irani, Hon'ble Minister of Human Resources and Shri Parkash Singh Badal, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Punjab for the following activities:

- i. Foundation Day Function
- ii. First Convocation
- iii. Laying of Foundation Stone of new campus

A formal letter from the Chancellor seeking appointment of the Visitor has already been sent through MHRD. However, in case it is not possible on 28th February 2014 for any reason, the laying of foundation stone and First convocation will be held as per the date given by the Visitor or some other VVIP.

The members unanimously **RESOLVED**, after discussions to wait for the response of the Visitor, Hon'ble President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee as Chief Guest for the above three functions of the University, as per availability of the Visitor.

Item No. EC:13:2015:7C

To consider the 2nd Innovators Day proposed to be organized by Innovators Club of the university on 22nd January 2015.

The members were informed that the Central University of Punjab, Bathinda has set up an Innovators Club in 2014 that will be a hub for sharing on promoting of creativity and exploration of new ideas for encouraging innovations. First Innovators day was organized on 17th January 2014.

He also explained the proposal as to how it will be achieved in the long run. For current activity, a series of events including Lectures from innovators will be organized during the 2nd Innovators Day on **22nd January, 2015**.

Students and general public is proposed to be invited for sharing of their innovations and working models. Prizes will be awarded to best three entries for schools and colleges. Participation certificates will be provided to all the participants. The budget to organize the event would be Rs. 97, 000/- (approximately).

The university is creating a facility for hands-on-tools for encouraging students general public to use the facilities free of cost under the guidance/or independent of guidance from the

university faculty for experimenting their ideas and innovations. The university may organize brainstorming discussions on such ideas and take the successful ones to the stage of filing of Patents under the names of inventor through the university.

Appreciating the efforts the members unanimously **RESOLVE**, to approve and encourage the activities of the Innovators Club of the university on 22nd January 2015.

Item No. EC:13:2015:8C

To consider the signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) as a part of Rashtriya Aavishkar Abhiyan, an initiative of MHRD with the selected school and colleges in the region.

The Vice Chancellor shared with the members that the University proposes to adopt a few local educational institutions with an objective of capacity building and inspiring research. This would also serve to meet the objectives of Rashtriya Aavishkar Abhiyan of MHRD through inspiring and motivating the young minds, teachers and students for research and innovations, the university is planning to sign MoUs with the following schools and colleges of the region.

For time being the following four schools/college are ready to enter into MoU with the University:

1. D.A.V. College, Biwi Wala Road, Bathinda.
2. Shaheed Sandeep Singh Govt. Senior Secondary School, Bathinda.
3. R.B. DAV Sr. Sec.Public School, Bathinda.
4. Silver Oaks School, Bibi Wala Road, Bathinda
5. Government Rajindra College, Bathinda.

Under this framework, teachers and students of the schools and colleges could be guided for innovation. They use the infrastructure/ facilities of the university including Library and Laboratories, could be permitted and without charges subject to the availability. They can also attend the seminars organized by the university and seek guidance from science/humanities faculty free of charge. The faculty and Research Fellows could be invited by the school/college for greater interaction with the student and staff on any academic issue. Such interactions are bound to be motivate and encourage young minds to adopt Research as their career.

The members unanimously appreciated the efforts and **RESOLVED**, to approve the signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) as a part of Rashtriya Aavishkar Abhiyan, an initiative of MHRD with the selected school and colleges in the region.

Item No. EC:13:2015:9C

To consider the minor modifications in *Clause No. 2.3 of M.Phil.-Ph.D. Integrated Programme Rules and Regulations (sub section (1) (b) of Section 28 of the Central Universities Act, 2009, as suggested by the internal committee constituted for this purpose.*

The Vice Chancellor brought to the notice of the EC the minor lacuna in the duration of the *M.Phil.-Ph.D. Integrated Programme*. In order to find some solution, the Vice Chancellor had constituted a committee. The recommendations of the committee were placed before the EC for its deliberations and approval.

A semester (s) may be declared a zero semester(s) in case of student who could not continue with the programme during that period due to illness and hospitalization or due to accepting a foreign scholarship/fellowship subject to the fulfilment of requirements as laid down by the relevant rules. Such zero semester (s) shall not be counted for calculation of the duration of the programme in case of such student.

Proposed modification

A semester (s) may be declared a zero semester(s) in case of student who could not continue with the programme during that period due to illness and hospitalization or due to accepting a foreign scholarship/fellowship subject to the fulfilment of requirements as laid down by the relevant rules, **and any other valid reason(s) subject to the approval of the competent authority.** Such zero semester (s) shall not be counted for calculation of the duration of the programme in case of such student.

After deliberations, the members unanimously

RESOLVED, to approve the recommendations of the committee and approved the minor inclusion/modification in the Clause No. 2.3 of M.Phil.-Ph.D. Integrated Programme Rules and Regulations.

Item No. EC:13:2015:10C

To consider the implementation of Aadhar Based Bio-metric Attendance System in the university.

The Vice Chancellor brought to the notice of the EC members that in view of the DoPT orders No. 11013/9/2014-Estt (A-III) dated 21st November 2014, the ministry has decided to introduce and implement the Aadhar enabled Bio-metric Attendance System (AEBAS) as a part of Digital India program.

He also told that the university has deputed a System Analyst as Nodal Officer for proper implementation and smooth functioning of Aadhar Based Attendance System in the university.

The members **RESOLVED** unanimously to adopt and implement the Aadhar enabled Bio-metric Attendance System (AEBAS) as a part of Digital India program introduced by the Ministry.

Item No. EC:13:2015:11C

To consider the panel of experts recommended by the members of Academic Council regarding the Selection Committee for appointment to the faculty positions.

The members were informed that as per the Statute 18(2) of the Central Universities Act 2009, there is a requirement of recommendation from the Academic Council regarding Constitution of Selection Committee for appointments of faculty, as per the details given below:

“Professor: Three persons not in the service of the university nominated by the Executive Council, out of a panel of names recommended by the Academic Council for their special knowledge of, or interest in the subject with which the Professor will be concerned”.

“Associate Professor: Two persons not in the service of the university nominated by the Executive Council, out of a panel of names recommended by the Academic Council for their special knowledge of, or interest in the subject with which the Associate Professor and Assistant Professor will be concerned”.

The university had requested the members of the

Academic Council to suggest a panel as per the above Staute, so that the university may expedite the recruitment process in various Schools/Centres.

The panel as suggested by the Academic Council was placed on the table for kind consideration and further nomination of the experts by the Executive Council.

The members unanimously **RESOLVED**, after discussions, to approve the panel as suggested by the Academic Council and authorize the Vice Chancellor to Selection Committee out of the list as per his wisdom and availability of the experts to the selection committee for various faculty positions.

Item No. EC:13:2015:12C

To consider the quality of work and time schedule of CPWD contractor at Main Campus.

The Vice Chancellor brought to the notice of the EC members, his following observations to his visit alongwith Prof. P. Ramarao, Dean Academic Affairs, and Mr. Tarsem Singh, Assistant Estate Supervisor, to the main campus on 9.1.2015 (m):

1. The progress of the road construction (sub-layer) is very slow. This work as per its schedule is to be completed before 14th January 2015. As against this even one third has not been completed.

In the light of the proposed visit of the Hon'ble President of India and Visitor of the university on 28th February 2015, very slow progress of work is a matter of serious worry.

2. It was observed that even after the strict instructions not to use ground water for constructions (as per MoU), the party is using the ground water that leads to the deterioration of life of the road. The ground water is full of Sulphates, Chlorides and heavy metals which are expected to reduce the longevity of the road. The team removed the electricity connectivity for pumping out water from the ground.
3. The workmanship of the construction is not up to the mark. The compaction and levelling of sub-layer of road is not being done properly.
4. The plantation around the boundary wall which

was raised by the CUP was found damaged very badly including the four big trees.

5. The team was told that the Senior Officers hardly visit the site. Site visit of the CPWD officials/site engineer required for the supervision of work, is not regular.

The members took a serious view of the matter and **RESOLVED** to authorize the Vice Chancellor to write a letter to the concerned Chief Engineer and the Director General, CPWD, ensuring the timely completion of the contract with good quality of material and workmanship.

The senior officers be also requested to take personal interest and regularly visit the site for proper regular monitoring. A copy of the letter be sent to the MHRD was also further **RESOLVED**.

It was also **RESOLVED** to send a copy to BAC for further action in this regard.

Item No EC:13:2015:13C

To consider the bio-data of Dr. Mridula Mittal, for the post of Medical Officer on part time/full time basis in the university on contractual basis.

The Vice Chancellor brought before to the note of the EC the acute problem of medical attention to the students, staff and faculty. The efforts of the university to recruit Medical Officers (male and female) through advertisement as well as requests on deputation have not yielded any positive results.

The members were also told that presently, there is only one Medical Attendant in the Health Centre of university to attend students and staff on day to day basis, who is not authorised to prescribe the medicine(s). Hence, one Medical Officer is required to administer the Health Centre of the university.

He shared the university has received a request from a lady doctor who is MD and worked for 5 years with Railways. On account of the transfer of his husband she had to shift to Bathinda and is now available to serve the university if approved. The Vice Chancellor placed her bio-data before EC.

In view of the urgency, it was suggested that the Bio-data of Dr. Mridula Mittal may be considered for the appointment to the post of Medical Officer on full

time/part-time basis on contractual basis for 12 months or till the post is filled up on regular basis, whichever is earlier. She be asked to stay on the campus or be available in a few minutes on call.

After discussions, the members **RESOLVED** to approve the appointment to the post of Medical Officer on full time/part-time basis on contractual basis for 12 months or till the post is filled up on regular basis, whichever is earlier. In case of part-time basis on a fixed emoluments of Rs. 30,000/- per month plus accommodation free of licence fee for atleast 4 hour stay. In case of full time appointment at the applicable salary as per prescribed rules. The Council advised to ensure that she be asked to stay on the campus or be available in a few minutes on call.

Item No EC:13:2015:14C

To consider the minor modifications in Clause No. 2.1 of M.Phil.-Ph.D. Integrated Programme Rules and Regulations (sub section (1) (b) of Section 28 of the Central Universities Act, 2009, regarding the rules and regulations to define the duration of payment for non-NET fellowships as suggested by the internal committee constituted for this purpose.

While presenting the agenda item, the Vice Chancellor told that at present, the university has defined the minimum (8 semesters) and maximum duration (12 semesters) for M.Phil.-Ph.D. Integrated Programme.

He explained that currently, non-NET fellowships which are being paid @ Rs. 5000/- during M.Phil. (first 3 semesters) and Rs. 8000/- during Ph.D. (next 5 semesters) for the students for the above period.

The tenure of Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship and Maulana Azad National Fellowship is 5 years.

He suggested that in view of the above, the duration of the fellowships of Ph.D. may also be similar to the other fellowships of Ph.D. programme. However, such extension should be performance linked, he argued.

After discussion, it was **RESLOVED** that in anticipation to the approval of the Academic Council, as recommended by the committee constituted for this purpose the following modifications in the existing M.Phil.-Ph.D. Integrated Programme Rules and Regulations vide clause No. 2.1 {Sub-section (1) (b) of Section 28 of the Central Universities Act, 2009} be accepted:

The minimum duration for completion of the Programme is 08 semesters and the maximum duration 12 semesters. Out of this period minimum of 03 semesters must be spent for M.Phil. phase of the Programme for which maximum duration is five consecutive semesters, or as may be decided by Academic Council from time to time.

2.1 (a) The minimum duration for completion of the Programme is 08 semesters and the maximum duration 12 semesters. Out of this period minimum of 03 semesters must be spent for M.Phil. phase of the Programme for which maximum duration is five consecutive semesters, or as may be decided by Academic Council from time to time.

2.1. (b) The fellowship for those who have one published/Accepted paper in indexed journals will be extended by one semester. In case of two publications, it will be extended by two semesters. The extension will be subject to good behaviour of the candidate

To consider the grant of Liveries to Group-C/D employees i.e. Drivers/Tractor drivers peons/Office Attendants/Multi-tasking staff at Central University of Punjab, Bathinda.

The Vice Chancellor to the notice of the EC the request application from one of the regular employees requesting for providing uniform like in other govt. offices.

Incidentally, the university rules are silent on this issue.

Consequently, a Committee was constituted to frame rules with respect to issuance of liveries to regular staff car Drivers, Peons/Office Attendant/MTS working at CUP.

The committee drafted the rules after taking into consideration the applicable rules of Gol and submitted the recommendations for norms for the issues of livery items to this category of staff (regular employees) along with rules to be followed by the users of the uniform.

The recommendations of the committee were placed for consideration of the Council.

The members of the Council considered these recommendations and after discussions, **RESOLVED** to approve the grant of Liveries to Group-C/D employees i.e. Drivers/Tractor drivers peons/Office Attendants/Multi-tasking staff at Central University of Punjab, Bathinda.

Item No EC:13:2015:16C

To consider the grant of compensatory leave for employees of the university.

Sub: Facility of Telephone (landline and/or mobile connection) at the residence in respect of entitled categories of Government employees.

The undersigned is directed to refer to the Department's O.M. of even no. dated 14.11.2006, on the subject mentioned above and to state that clarification have been sought by various Ministries/Departments about certain issues relating with the implementation of the aforesaid O.M. like the number of connections qualifying for reimbursement, whether the taxes applicable were to be paid for by the officer or office, whether the entitlement of the residential telephone is to be regulated by this O.M. etc.

2. The queries/doubts raised by various quarters have been duly examined and the following clarifications are issued:

1. A. Salient Features of Tender:

1. After strong deliberation, Committee was approved the budget of Rs. 136.25 crore.
2. The Committee was decided that contractor shall make his own arrangement for electric power supply and construction water. Power and water may be made available by CUPB, if available at site on chargeable basis.
3. Committee decided that PMC should start working from the site as soon as possible.

1. B. Tendering Procedure:





It has been decided to use an AADHAR Enabled Bio-metric Attendance System (AEBAS) in all offices of the Central Government, including attached/ sub-ordinate Offices, in India. The system will be installed in the offices located in Delhi/ New Delhi by 31st December 2014. In other places this may be installed by 26th January 2015

2. The equipment will be procured by the Ministries/ Departments as per specifications of DeitY on DGS&D Rate Contract from authorized vendors. The expenditure will be met by the Ministries/ Departments concerned under their O.E. The manual system of attendance may be phased out accordingly.

3. The Department of Electronics and Information Technology (DeitY) will provide the technical guidance for installing the system. The equipment already procured by DeitY have a built in AMC of three years. The Ministries/ departments may ensure that the equipment being procured by them have similar provision.

4. Biometric attendance system is only an enabling platform. There is no change in the instructions relating to office hours, late attendance etc. which will continue to apply. As per extant instructions, (contained in DoPT O.M. No: 28034/8/75- Estt-A dated 04-07-1975; No:28034/10/75-Estt-A dated 27-08-1975; No: 28034/3/82 -Estt-A dated 05-03-1982) half-a-day's Casual Leave should be debited for each day of late attendance, but late attendance upto an hour, on not more than two occasions in a month, and for justifiable reasons may be condoned by the competent authority. In addition to debiting Casual Leave (or Earned Leave, when no CL is available). Disciplinary action may also be taken against government

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

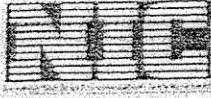



In view of that the following addition is proposed by the committee to include the rules and regulations to define the duration of payment for non-NET fellowships as follows:

Proceedings of the Meeting of the Committee constituted to submit its recommendations for framing of rules for providing the uniform to Group 'C' and Group 'D' regular employees

As directed by the Competent Authority the Committee again met in the office chamber of the Dean Academic Affairs to frame suitable rules to be followed by the users of the Uniform. After detailed discussion the committee recommended the following:

1. Stitching of Uniform

The common categories of Staff eligible for supply of uniforms may be given the required cloth (Summer and Winter) to enable them to have the uniforms stitched as per the laid down pattern of Government of India.

It may please be noted that the reimbursement of stitching charges at the prescribed rates should be done only after the stitched uniforms are produced which are duly stamped with an indelible ink at an appropriate place on the wrong side of the stitched dress for identification. It must be ensured that the employees produce the stitched uniforms within a reasonable period (one month) after the cloth was supplied to them

2. Supply of shoes / chappals:

The shoes / chappals as a part of uniform are to be procured from the approved agencies where available or from Consumer Co-operative Stores. The existing rates of shoes / chappals duly notified by the Government of India should be followed.

The above orders will apply for procurement up to one lakh rupees, subject to any other limitations laid down by the DGS & D rate-contract.

3. Special shoes for orthopaedically handicapped:

As per agreement with the staff representatives of the National Council (JCM), the Orthopaedically handicapped employees can be supplied special type of shoes (in lieu of the normal shoes/chappals) as per Govt. of India Norms, based on the Medical Certificate from the Competent Authority.

4. Proper use, care and maintenance of Uniforms:

The employees provided with uniforms are required to turn out in proper and clean uniforms. Non wearing of uniforms not only attract disciplinary action but further supply of uniforms is to be discontinued if the employee is found to be attending to his duties without wearing uniforms regularly.

In order to ensure compliance by an individual employee, the desirability of introducing the system of parade of these employees may be considered and for this purpose an officer may be designated as Inspecting Officer for parade and cases of delinquencies may be suitably dealt with by the Office.

5. Washing Allowance:

The employees who are provided with uniform are eligible for grant of Washing Allowance as per Government of India Norms.

6. Surrender, withdrawal, recovery and re-issue of uniforms:

The supply of uniforms is subject to the condition that these cannot be claimed as a right and that the uniforms do not become the personal property of the employee. In the event of discharge, promotion or resignation of an employee, all items of uniforms should be withdrawn from him or proportionate cost thereof recovered. Similar action should be taken in the case of employees who are retired compulsorily as a result of disciplinary proceedings. All items of uniforms should be withdrawn from employees, to whom the uniform is given by the office, who are under suspension. Uniforms may again be supplied to them if and when they are reinstated in service, and the period of suspension should be excluded in determining the date of entitlement for next issue.

7. In the case of employees retiring on superannuation pension:-

(a) Summer uniforms:

- i. No uniform be issued to eligible employees who are due to retire within three months from the date they become eligible for the issue of uniforms;
- ii. One set of uniform may be issued to such of those employees who are due to retire within one year (Not less than 3 months) from the date they are eligible for the supply of uniforms;
- iii. Complete set of uniforms may be issued to such of these employees who are due to retire after one year from the date they become eligible for the issue of uniforms.

(b) Winter uniforms:

No item of winter uniform may be supplied unless it could be used by the employees for at least half of its prescribed life before retirement.

Uniform should not be withdrawn from employees who are suffering or have suffered, from infectious or contagious diseases, or from those who die while in service. In cases where any item of uniforms issued to eligible employees is lost due to theft or fire, which was not due to his own negligence, the administrative authorities may, at their discretion, issue a fresh item of uniforms on receipt of a copy of the First Information Report from the Police or Fire authorities. Action to 'write off' the loss may be taken in consultation with the appropriate financial authorities, after the Police have confirmed that there are no chances of the theft being traced.

All possible efforts should be made to re-issue the withdrawn uniforms, especially the costly items like overcoats, leather jackets and blankets, to other employees for the remaining portion of the life of the items. Items of uniforms which cannot be so re-issued, should be disposed of to the best advantage of Government in accordance with the general financial provisions governing the disposal of obsolete stores.

8. Uniforms for female employees:

The eligible common categories of female employees are supplied 2 sarees with 3 matching blouses and 3 petticoats in a period of one year. The sarees are to be procured from the National Textile Corporation @ [Rs.172] per saree (or as notified by GOI). The specification for the blouse is poplene or khadi cloth and for the petticoats, I.S.3771-1966 or as notified by GOI

Such of the employees who may be habitual wearers of salwar-kameez and dupatta may be issued these livery items in lieu of saree, blouse and petticoat subject to the condition that the cost of salwar-kameez and dupatta and the stitching charges taken

together should not exceed the cost of sarees, blouse and petticoat. The cloth issued for salwar-kameez and dupatta should correspond to the usual type of cloth prescribed for uniform. The length of the dupatta could be such as is considered normally adequate for the purpose.

9. Procurement of liveries:

The University through a purchase committee shall procure all livery items as per prescribed specification of GOI at the rate contract fixed by the DGS & D except for the items for which separate approved agencies have been laid down (as in the case of woollen cloth, tricot cloth for pants, sarees for lady employees and shoes / chappals). Where local purchase is permissible as per orders issued by the DGS & D and in terms of the General Financial Rules, prescribed procedure should be followed in this regard by the committee. Where local purchase is permissible (as per limit laid down by the Department of Supply) and the local rates are higher than the rate contract fixed by the DGS & D, such purchases could be made by the University upon the recommendation of the committee subject to its approval by the Competent Authority.



Subject: Report on presentations by faculty in DAV School, Bathinda.

The Rashtriya Aavishkar Abhiyaan committee of CUPB has initiated a programme to inculcate a desire for enquiry-based learning and oscillate the students towards the fields of maths and science. In this context faculty from CUPB visited the RBDVA School, Bathinda and delivered lectures on various current and upcoming issues.

The visit was organised in two phases in first phase on 17 December, 2014 the following faculty from Biological Sciences delivered lectures.

- Dr Sandeep Singh from Centre for Genetic Diseases and Molecular Medicine talked about "**Cancer, Facts and Myths**". The topic was selected to educate the young students about cancer disease which is prevalent in Malwa region of Punjab and what can be potential causative agents. What is known about the disease and what are various types of treatments available. The topic further educated the students that having active life style with moderate eating habits and no smoking and alcohol can greatly reduce the risk of the disease. Further various myths regarding cancer were discussed and busted. The overall aim was to educate the students about cancer so that these young and aware minds and further spread the message to their families and known people.
- Dr. Monisha Dhiman, Centre for Genetic Diseases and Molecular Medicine delivered lecture on "**Infectious Diseases: Focus on AIDS and Ebola**". The lecture was based on very basic knowledge about history of microbes, types of microbes, microbial diseases, with emphasis on the viral diseases. Later the students were given introduction to immune system and various host's protective immune mechanisms are compromised during infectious diseases. The focus of the lecture was to enlighten the students about the deadly diseases such AIDS and recent Ebola outbreak. Their transmission, risks, clinical detection and various diagnostic/available serological testing for these diseases was discussed. In the end of the lecture the surprise quiz was given to the students.

In the second phase on 19 December, 2014 the following faculty from Physical and Chemical Sciences delivered lectures.

- Dr. Kamlesh Yadav from Centre for Physical and Mathematical Sciences delivered a lecture on the topic "**Nano-Technology: The Technology of the Future**". The lecture was based on the basics of nanoscience and nanotechnology and some important current developments in nanotechnology. The talk was mainly about the understanding very small sizes, difference in nanoscience and nanotechnology, different approaches to fabricate nanomaterials and their types, why are nanomaterials so special? How the nanomaterials can be created by precise manipulation of materials at atomic scale and how nanotechnology can change our future? The applications of nanotechnology such as Lotus effect, materials paint, paint that cleans air, A DVD that could hold a million movies, health care: detecting diseases, cosmetics, sports equipment, food preservation and packing, solar cells, water

purification, nano-robots and molecular nanotechnology etc was discussed. After the lecture, students discussed their many queries related to nanotechnology.

- Dr Nagendra Babu from Centre for Environmental Science and Technology delivered a lecture "Carbon in our Environment". The talk was to aware the various physico-chemical aspects of carbon, that are of considerable importance to the understanding the newer environmental thought process. The talk involved the various manifestations of humans in the carbon cycle and how brings alive the phenomenon of Greenhouse effect and climate change, open biomass burning etc. The seminar also introduced the various jargons in environment like the Kyoto Protocol and Carbon Credit, Carbon Footprint, Carbon Capture and storage, carbon sequestration. The talk emphasized on the basic scientific phenomena whether physical, chemical or biological, of various carbonaceous components in the environment and how they can serve as the carbon sink for our future.

Outcome: All the lectures were well received by the students which was evidenced by the curiosity they had after most of the lectures. The discussion and question session was very interactive and students were able to shed their inhibitions to discuss the lectures related issues.

The Rashtriya Aavishkar Abhiyan committee has created a google group ID which is shared with the students so that in future if they have any queries they can directly interact with the faculty involved.
