PROCEEDINGS OF THE THIRTEENTH MEETING OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

HELD IN IISER, MOHALI ON 10th MARCH, 2016

Leave of absence was granted to Dr. K. P. Singh, Joint Secretary (CU), UGC.

However attendance of Joint Secretary & Financial Advisor, MHRD was marked *in absentia*, who participated in the meeting not in person but through their comments/considerations/opinions item-wise through email. Their comments were considered and discussed.

Welcome Note of the Vice Chancellor

The Chairman formally welcomed the members of the Finance Committee and thanked them for sparing their valuable time from their busy schedule to attend the 13th meeting of Finance Committee. He then introduced Sh. Sanjay Kumar, an MHRD nominee who attended the meeting for the first time.

The Secretary apprised the members that the minutes of the Twelfth Meeting of Finance Committee were circulated to all the members of the Committee on 1st January 2016. No comments were received from any member.

The members discussed the case in light of the comments received from MHRD (Annexure-13.4) and suggested that matters is purely administrative, which needs to be dealt with as per instructions/guidelines of the DOP&T and UGC. It was further suggested that the item should be withdrawn and if there is any doubt, the matter may be taken to UGC/DOP&T for advice

RESOLVE

After discussion, the Finance Committee resolved that this item be withdrawn in view of the comments of MHRD.

The Finance Committee further resolved to recommend to EC that the matter may be dealt with as per rules of DOP&T and UGC, and if there is any doubt on any point, the matter may be taken to UGC/DOP&T for advice.

To consider the request of Dr. Somesh Barnwal, Assistant Professor for retaining DBT Ramalingaswami Fellowship

The Secretary briefed the members that Dr. Somesh Barnwal, Assistant Professor, Centre for Biochemistry and Microbial Sciences, CUPB has requested to avail of his DBT Ramalingaswami Fellowship in lieu of the Assistant Professor's Salary (Annexure-13.5).

The DBT terms & conditions for availing Ramalingaswamy Fellowship (Annexure-13.6), under the heading 'Role of the Fellow' vide Para 3 states that:

(Pages 34 to 36)

"Fellow can accept a regular position in an Indian Institution anytime during the tenure of fellowship. Approval has to be sought from DBT, and usually, it will be readily given. In such a scenario, the Fellow can opt:

- a) *To retain the fellowship (in lieu of the salary) along with the contingency/research grant, or..."*

The Committee discussed the matter in light of facts and also comments received from MHRD



(Annexure-13.4) as also the terms and conditions and permission of the sponsoring agency of Govt. of India (DBT), and suggested that the matter be further forwarded to UGC for approval and then allow as per concurrence of UGC.

It was argued that since it is a Govt. of India Scheme wherein terms and conditions (Annexure-13.6) provide for such facility and the government has allowed so the university should not have any objection to such a facility to meritorious faculty members.

RESOLVE

The Finance Committee, after deliberations, resolved to recommend to EC to consider the request of Dr. Somesh Barnwal, subject to concurrence of UGC.

To consider the Expenditure Estimates, Additional funds Requirement under the head Grant in Aid Salary, and the Utilization of Funds.

While presenting the item, the Secretary informed that CUPB prepared the expenditure details; budget estimates, additional funds requirement under the head Grant in Aid Salary; and the Information on Utilization of Funds under XII plan General Development Assistance as on 31.12.2015 is forwarded herewith as per format I, II, V, VI, VII (a), VII (B) and GFR 19A. The information is derived from Format V of the Utilization of Funds received from UGC, New Delhi vide their letter No. F. No.1-1/2012 (CU) dated 25.08.2015.

The members discussed the expenditure estimates, additional funds, utilization of funds etc. and suggested to consider the same.

After deliberations, the Finance Committee resolved to recommend to EC the Expenditure Estimates, Additional funds Requirement under the head Grant in Aid Salary, and the Utilization of Funds.

The Secretary put before members the recommendations of 29th meeting of the Building



Advisory Committee held on 30th December 2015 at Mohali along with Abstract Cost of Building

Advisory Committee held on 30th December 2015 at IK Gujral PTU Mohali Campus, Mohali to discuss the matter related to proposal of EIL regarding (Annexure-13.8):

- Difficulties faced with present contractor;
- Abstract cost of building;
- Due payment to RITES against construction of boundary wall of main campus, Ghudda;
- Correction of area and amount of agreement of Phase-I for architectural services on actual basis;
- Depositing Rs. 40 Crore in escrow account for project work Phase-I;
- Progress of ongoing building works of CUPB (upto 31st January 2016) etc.

While discussing, the members suggested that the university must prioritise the buildings keeping in view the availability/approval of budget.

After in depth discussion, the Finance Committee resolved to note and accept the recommendations of the BAC meeting held on 30th December 2015 and recommend to EC the Minutes of 29th Meeting of Building Advisory Committee held on 30th December 2015 at Mohali and Abstract Cost of Building.

It was further resolved to recommend that the university must prioritise the buildings keeping in view the budget availability/approval.

RESOLVE

Item:FC:13:2016:8

1. To consider the request of a student regarding financial aid for participating in IT Olympiad

The Secretary apprised that CUPB received a request from Mr. Jaskaran Singh, a student of M.Tech of the CUPB for financial assistance to participate in grand finale of IT Olympiad 2016 (on 27th February 2016), a National Level Competition, organized by Computer Society of India (CSI) and Rotary Club Pune (Annexure-13.9).

He made the request in view of shortage of time and disturbance in Haryana at that time and



cancellation of trains. He consequently had to travel by air and had to pay R. 9,000/- as airfare.

Mr. Jaskaran Singh won the Olympiad and he received an award of Rs. 1 Lac cash prize and a job offer.

The Secretary said that it is a matter of great pride for the university. He brought laurels to the university and encouraged others to participate in such events.

There is no separate budgetary head available for considering such case. However, as per Section 11 (3) of the Central Universities Act, 2009:

"The Vice Chancellor may, if he is of the opinion that immediate action is necessary on any matter, exercise any power conferred on any authority of the University by or under this Act and shall report to such authority at its next meeting the action taken by him on such matter..."

Members discussed the request of the student and suggested that university should develop a corpus to deal with such financial cases. They further suggested that 'fine system' should be established and this amount may be utilised for dealing with these financial situations/awards/ financial help, etc.

They also suggested that CUPB should use solutions, which don't involve any financial implications and which are as per CAG guidelines.

After discussion, the Finance Committee resolved to recommend to EC the request of Mr. Jaskaran Singh, an M.Tech. student for financial assistance to attend grand finale of IT Olympiad.

RESOLVE

FC further resolved to recommend to EC that university should develop a corpus to deal with such financial cases in future.



2. To consider the request of Prof. Hangloo, a former Professor of CUPB, regarding his leave and pension contribution

The Secretary informed the members that CUPB published advertisement No. T-01(2010) for recruitment of the faculty through open (rolling) system and Prof. R.L. Hangloo applied for the post of the Professor in the Centre for South and Central Asian Studies, CUPB. His application form was duly forwarded by the University of Hyderabad (UoH) on 20th April 2010.

On the recommendation of the Executive Council in its meeting held on 28th October 2010, Prof. Hangloo was issued an offer of appointment on Regular basis (Annexure-13.10). He accepted the offer of appointment (Annexure-13.11).

Prof. Hangloo was relieved from UoH on Extra Ordinary Leave (EOL) of two years from 1st January 2011 to 31st December 2012 (Annexure-13.12) and joined the CUPB on 1st January 2011 (FN). Due to serious personal and family problem, Prof. Hangloo resigned on 22.06.2011 and requested for releasing his pension contribution. The resignation of Prof. Hangloo was accepted w.e.f. 30th June 2011.

Vide email dated 12th July 2011, Prof. Hangloo again requested for the transfer TA and pension contribution of 6 months i.e. from January to June 2011. In response to his request, the CUPB wrote him letter on 9th August 2011 stating that as per clause No. 5 & 7 of the appointment letter, there is no provision for said benefits (Annexure-13.13).

On 9th August 2016, Prof Hangloo again requested for the pension contribution and the Registrar, CUPB sent the letter to the Registrar, UoH requesting him to send the calculation of the amount of pension contribution alongwith copy of relevant rules (Annexure-13.14).

On 30th October 2014, Prof. Hangloo, now Vice chancellor of University of Kalyani wrote to the Vice chancellor, CUPB that he is entitled for the pension benefits and the UoH has sent the calculation sheet and other documents but as per his personal file no such letter/document is available or received in the CUPB.



However the accounts section of the university has calculated his leave salary and pension contribution which is Rs. 48,299 and Rs. 83,425 respectively. (Annexure-13.15). But the audit of the university raised objections (Annexure-13.16), which are re-produced as under:

1. The leave salary and pension contribution are paid to the persons in Foreign Service. However Professor Hangloo has joined on regular position here in CUPB (not on deputation). Hence the rules are not applicable to him.
2. Prof. Hangloo was relieved in 2011 and the rules are passed by EC in 2015, hence it can't be implemented retrospectively.
3. No such promise has been made in the appointment letter.
4. As I can check from the MHRD letter Nu. F. 50-4/2015 –Desk (U) dated 3rd September 2015, they have advised to act according to GOI rules and has not directed for such payment.

Keeping the above in view, it will not be justified to pay leave salary and pension to Prof. Hangloo.

It is pertinent to mention here that in a similar case, the requests of Controller of Examinations and Registrar was put up before the EC in its 15th meeting and the EC resolved the following:

"After detailed deliberations, the Chairman withdrew this item, as there is no need for amendment in the ordinances. It was RESOLVED to authorize the Vice Chancellor to take the executive decision. It was also decided that after the incumbents join the university, their representation be sent to MHRD for concurrence of the executive decision."

Accordingly a letter was written to MHRD on 24-06-2015 (Annexure-13.18) and MHRD replied on 3rd September 2015 that Leave salary and pension contribution of the Registrar and Controller of Examinations may be released to their parent organization as per central Government Rules. (Annexure-13.19)

Members discussed the case in depth and suggested that it is an administrative matter and the CUPB must decide it as per rules.

They further suggested that the matter may be sent to MHRD for approval on the same analogy as the case of Controller of Examinations and Registrar was earlier sent to MHRD for approval.

The Finance Committee, after discussion, resolved that it is an administrative matter, which must be dealt as per rules. However, approval of MHRD must be sought on the same analogy as per the similar cases of Registrar and Controller of Examinations.

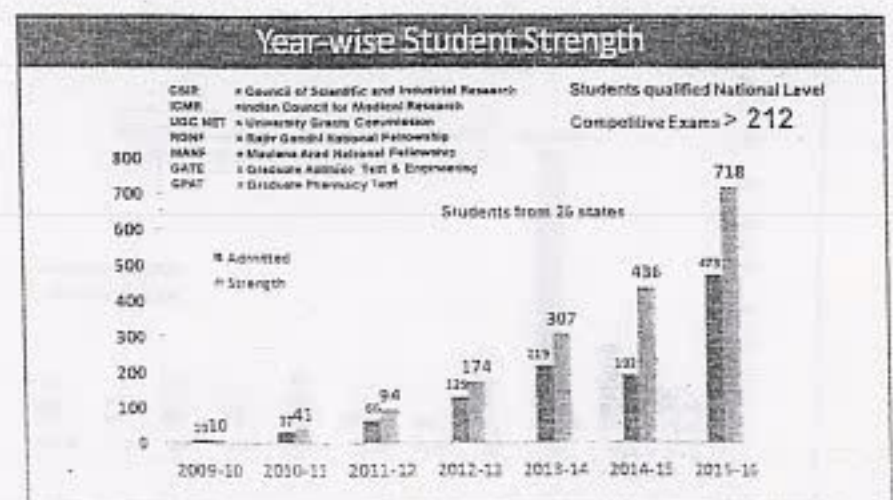

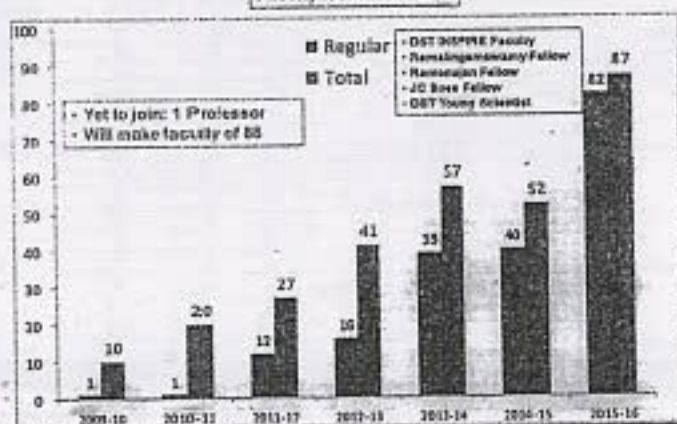

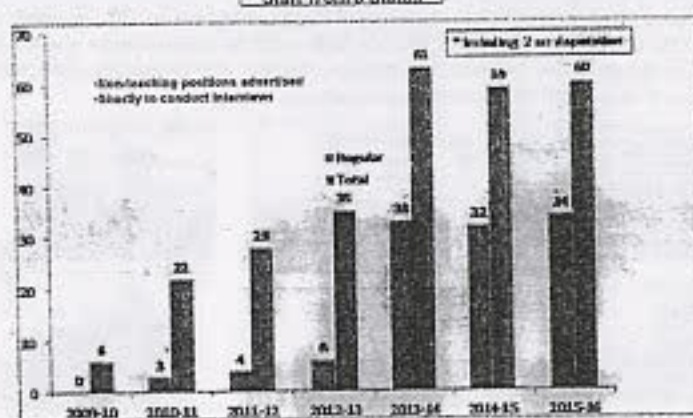
No. of Faculty Members

Faculty from 17 States



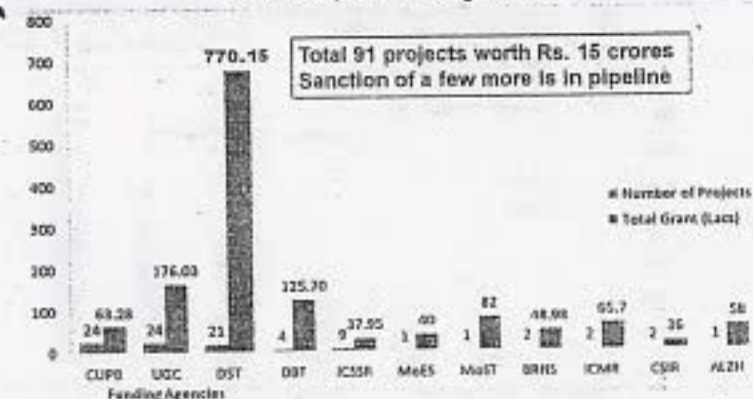
No. of Non-teaching Staff

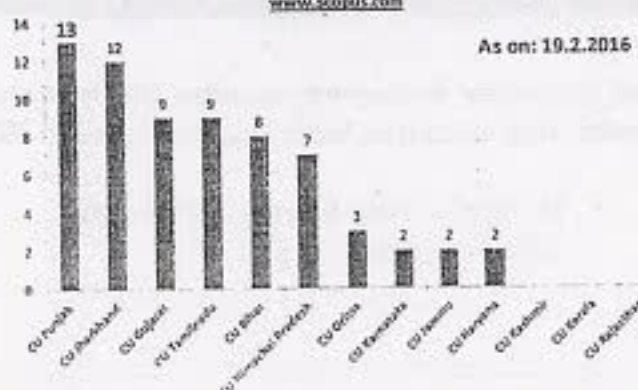

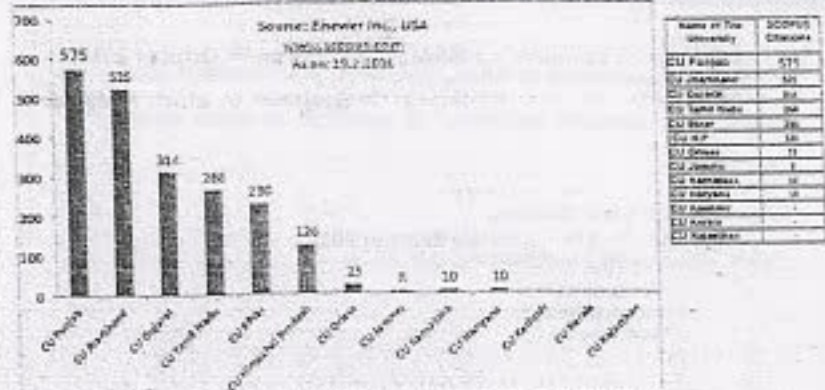
Relative h-index of New Central Universities

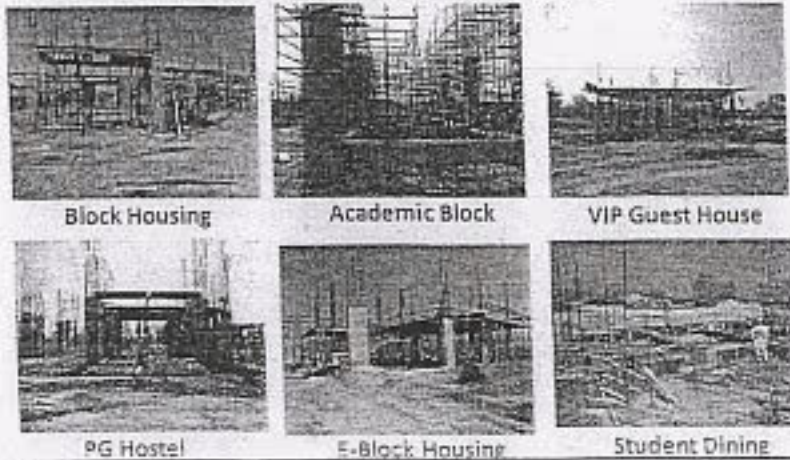


Master Plan of main campus


5. Dr. Mridula Mittal, Medical Officer:



Role of Department of Biotechnology

1. The Department of Biotechnology (DBT) would release fellowship grant (Rs. 85,000/- p.m.) House Rent Allowance (HRA) @ Rs. 7,500/- p.m. consolidated and Research/ contingency grant Rs. 10.00 lakhs for the 1st yr., Rs. 7.50 lakhs for 2nd year and Rs. 5.00 lakhs for 3rd, 4th and 5th year.
2. Grant for subsequent years would be released based on the scientific review of the work done, submission of UC/SE and annual progress report.
3. During the tenure of the fellowship the awardee is not entitled to any kind of salary. However he/she can apply for research grant to various funding agencies through their host institute. The information on the details of projects applied/sanctioned by the agencies may be made available to DBT from time-to-time.
4. DBT may be kept informed about IPR issues and technology developed/commercialized if any during the tenure of the fellowship.
5. DBT reserves right to discontinue fellowship at any stage and change terms & conditions of fellowship.

Role of the Fellow

1. Each fellow is entitled to a fellowship of Rs. 85,000/- p.m., house rent allowance (HRA) @ Rs. 7,500/- p.m. consolidated and research/ contingency grant of Rs. 10.00 lakhs for the 1st yr., Rs. 7.50 lakhs for 2nd year and Rs. 5.00 lakhs for 3rd, 4th and 5th year. The research/ contingency grant can be utilized towards purchase of equipments, consumables, international and domestic travel, engaging manpower and other contingent expenditure to be incurred in connection with the implementation of the project. In exceptional cases, the duration of the award could be extended by another five years on fresh appraisal.
2. Each awardee is expected to avail the fellowship for a minimum period of three years from date of start of fellowship.
3. A fellow can accept a regular position in an Indian Institution anytime during the tenure of the fellowship. Approval has to be sought from DBT, and usually, it will be readily given. In such a scenario, the Fellow can opt
 - (a) To retain the fellowship (in lieu of the salary) along with the contingency/research grant, or
 - (b) For the regular salary of the job, in which case only the contingency/research grant from the fellowship can be availed

- (c) In case fellow is able to seek a permanent position during the tenure of the fellowship he/she will not be considered for a 2nd term
- (d) Fellows/Awardee can change his/her host institute only once during the tenure of the fellowship.
4. The awardee can take up the fellowship within six months from the date of issue of the award letter. In case the awardee does not join within this period, it will be assumed that he/she is no longer interested and the fellowship will automatically stand cancelled. Therefore, each awardee should communicate the likely date of joining promptly.
 5. In case of leave/travel, the rules of the host institute where the awardee proposes to work are to be followed.
 6. During the tenure of the fellowship, awardee is not entitled to any kind of salary. Fellows are encouraged to apply for research grant to various funding agencies through their host institutes.
 7. Since the fellowship is routed through host institute, the awardee should abide by the contractual obligations of that institute.
 8. The awardee will submit annual progress report and UC/SE to the Department.
 9. The support of DBT should be duly acknowledged in the publications (papers, reports etc.) by the fellows.
 10. Fellows are required to make mandatory presentations about progress before review committee at the end of 2nd year.
 11. Fellows applying for second term should submit their proposal in advance (6 months) and submit a detailed report on achievements in last 5 yrs. of fellowship.
 12. Fellows selected for second term will receive a contingency/research grant @ Rs. 5.00 lakhs p.a.
 13. For all other clarifications such as change of host institute, absence of three months duration or beyond and other matters related to the effective utilization of the fellowship, DBT should be contacted at least 15 days in advance for necessary clearances and approvals.
 14. Applicants selected for the RLF award should send the letter of acceptance duly signed and forwarded copy of terms and conditions (in original) along with the likely date of joining should be sent to Dr. Meenakshi Munshi, Director, (Tel. Phone No. 011-24361035, Email : meenakshi29@dbt.nic.in) Department of Biotechnology, Block-2, 7th Floor, CGO Complex, Lodi Road, New Delhi - 110 003.

Role of the Host Institute

1. The host institute accepting a Ramalingaswami Fellow should provide the necessary space, research facilities and other administrative support to conduct research under this fellowship.
2. The awardee would be governed by the rules and regulations of the host institute with regard to leave/travel and other related issues.
3. a) If the host institute is providing free accommodation, no House Rent Allowance (HRA) is admissible and same needs to be refunded to the Department.
b) If the host institute is deducting HRA and license fee for the accommodation provided, then the same shall be recovered from the HRA being paid to the fellow. However, reimbursement shall be limited to the HRA being paid by DBT. Excess recovery, if any, has to be made by the host institute directly from the fellow.

As regards the medical benefits, host institute may consider giving medical benefits from their own resources at level of Scientist 'D' as applicable to their regular faculty.
5. Host institute will maintain separate account of the grant released and would submit UC/SE at the end of the financial year.
6. Institute will maintain a separate audit head of account for the grant received from DBT.
7. Institute will ensure effective utilization of grant given by DBT for the purpose for which it was granted and to ensure timely progress of the work.





The MoM of 28th meeting of BAC were circulated to all the members of the Committee through e-mail. As there were no comments received from the members, the Minutes of 28th BAC were approved (refer annexure-A).

- A. To consider the due payment to RITES against construction of boundary wall of main campus Ghudda.

The Executive Engineer CUPB reported that the work of construction of boundary wall is completed by M/s. RITES PMC. The final payment of Rites should be released to close the account.

Committee considered and asked the payments details to be paid be placed before the committee for consideration.

- B. Correction of area and amount in agreement of phase-I for Architectural Services on actual basis.

The committee considered and deliberated on the agenda item and the following decisions were taken.

1. *Presently, the phase is being executed in two parts (1A & 1B) with an estimated cost of Rs 213 crore.*
2. *The present agreement with the architect is for Rs. 100 crores as per clause 4.1(j). As per the Agreement relevant clause, a supplementary agreement has to be signed with PSDA.*
3. *Worthy VC is requested to appoint a committee to consider and make suitable recommendations for the supplementary agreement. The terms of reference may be worked out suitably as per the existing agreement.*
4. *Payments to PSDA may be released as per the agreement.*

- C. EIL has asked to deposit Rs. 40 crore in escrow account for Project Work Phase 1 (refer annexure-D).

The committee reviewed the progress of PSDA and EIL for floating of tender for phase-IB (priority buildings) along with ongoing works of phase-IA. EIL suggested that since the work for phase 1B is to be allotted within short time and the work of phase 1A is also going on for which replenishment of the funds is required as per the estimated quantum of work being executed per month. The funds need to be transferred to Escrow Project Account as already proposed as per Annexure-D

The committee considered the request of EIL and agreed to release the payment of Rs. 40 crores as per Annexure-D







Item No. BAC:28:2015:2 **To discuss Action Taken Report of 27th meeting of BAC held on 26th October, 2015.**

The meeting consider ATR on the decisions taken at 27th Meeting of BAC held on 26-10-2015.

Committee noted.

Item No. BAC:28:2015:3 **To consider and approve the recommendations of Sub Committee of BAC for buildings plan and preliminary estimate of Phase IB for priority buildings as approved in 27th meeting of BAC.**

The committee considered the recommendations of 21st meeting of Subcommittee of BAC regarding approval of floor plan, basic sections, preliminary estimate based upon plinth area rates of CPWD amounting to Rs. 97.00 cr.

The committee found that floor plans section are acceptable for UG hostels, Transit Hostel, VC Office and site development works but the VC Residence need some more face-lifting of the building. The committee has found that P.E. cost is more than sanctioned amount of Rs. 78.00 cr hence the Architect should work out detailed cost with approved plans and prepare a tender document for cost near to sanctioned amount, in case the cost substantially increases the sanctioned amount the VC Office building can be hold up for the time being.

Meeting considered and approved floor plans and sections for all priority buildings. The architect will improve the aesthetics of VC residence. The architect to submit the detailed drawing and cost

estimate along with BOQ up to 10th January 2016. The cost of tender should be near about 78 cr. All activities of approval of plans floor from PUDA/detail drawings/Design to be planned by the architect and fil with in accepted time frame.

Item No. BAC:28:2015:4

- (a) To consider and approve the deposit of balance funds for left hand side portion of entrance corridor.

The committee consider the recommendations of Subcommittee of BAC and unanimously agreed to release the payment of Rs. 126.65 lac against demand of funds for left hand side portion of entrance corridor at main campus to CPWD work.

Meeting considered and unanimously approved.

- (b) To consider the priority between right hand side portion of main corridor and missing link portion between left hand side portion corridor and roads being constructed under phase-IA works by M/s. KSMB and approval drawings accordingly. To accord approval to Executive Engineer CPWD to proceed with work (refer annexure-D). A map showing details of work executed by CPWD, the portion for which CPWD has advance deposited and missing link is placed below as annexure-D1.

Quality of concrete of ongoing phase-IA works:


The Executive Engineer, CUPB with due permission of the chair submitted that the quality of concrete is continuously a cause for concern. The contractor submitted a mix design of M-30 concrete in foundation from HT Kanpur with cement content of 500 kg/cm (PPC). This much cement content is more than codal provisions of 450kg/cum more. The provision in estimate is for 330 kg/cm. Thus extra payment for 170 kg/cm is to be made at the same time concrete cubes are not giving proportionate 7 days strength. The quality of cement is not being assured by EIL. As the strength of concrete is not being attained. The EIL is working with wait and watch policy. The contractor is doing work at very slow pace.


The committee recommended that EIL should take care of quality of cement and concrete, at least 10% samples should get tested from Guru Nanak Engineering College, Ludhiana/Punjab Engineering College Chandigarh on regular basis.

2. The representative of EIL has also conveyed that there is no major issue from PSDA side and endorsed the performance. Committee noted the same.
3. The committee reviewed the clause no. 4.1 (J) and clause 2 second para of agreement and recommended a supplementary agreement is to be signed with Architect for enhanced area 97,000 s.q.m. and the amount at a tune of Rs. 215 crores, in view of the availability of funds from Govt. against agreement condition 4.1(J). The committee unanimously recommends to enhance the area and amount through a supplementary agreement.
4. The committee also recorded to keep the same terms and conditions of agreement including payment and liquidated damages.
5. Committee discussed regarding non availability of PERT/Bar chart from EIL & PSDA. Committee conveyed to EIL & PSDA that as discussed in previous meetings, EIL & PSDA will provide the detailed bar chart regarding progress of work, time frame and issuing of drawings for easy monitoring of work progress at main site for all BAC meetings.

6. The committee also consider releasing of payments due to PSDA. The committee recommends to release the payment along with service tax on receipt of undertaking from PSDA that in case if the service tax is not payable then PSDA will refund the paid amount towards service tax.

Resolve of Meeting of 1st meeting of Executive Council held on 2nd June 2015

Item No. EC/15/15/66.3

To consider minor amendments in the Ordinances related to the Terms and Conditions of Service of the Registrar and Controller of Examinations.

The Chairman initiated the discussion on the appointment of Dr. Pankaj Khare as Registrar and Dr. Jagdeep Singh as Controller of Examinations, subsequent to approval of the selection committee from Executive Council. He shared with the members that prior to his joining as Vice Chancellor, these posts were advertised for appointments on the basis of direct recruitment/deputation (Annexure -1). As per the Act of the university, these are tenure posts upto 5 years term.

He told that duly constituted Selection Committee that included two honourable members of the EC had unanimously selected these two appointees.

Upon approval of the selections from the EC, they were sent the letters of appointment. In response, Dr. Pankaj Khare and Dr. Jagdeep Singh asked for contribution towards leave salary and pension to the parent organizations as per rules.

Dr. Pankaj is from Central Govt. organization while Dr. Jagdeep from Punjab Govt. Since they have a long service to their credit and are covered under Pension Scheme of the Government applicable to employees prior to 2003, [those appointed fresh after 2004 are covered under New Pension Scheme (NPS)]. Further, since they have many years to go before attaining the age of superannuation, they want not to forgo the credits earned during the past service period towards old age pension which is fully justified.

Arguing further, he brought to the notice of the members that Dr. Pankaj Khare and Dr. Jagdeep Singh want to maintain lien with their respective parent organizations and have applied for applicable leave for the period they serve our university. In their representations, Dr. Pankaj Khare and Dr. Jagdeep Singh desired that their requests towards leave and pension be considered in light of ordinances of some other Central Universities (CUs) including new CUs like Central University of Rajasthan and Central University of Karnataka. They need our acceptance of their request (Annexure-2) and (Annexure-3) for contribution towards leave encashment and pension enabling them to join.

He shared that the matter came under the general discussion in the Selection Committee meeting held on 1st June 2015 in the MHRD office. It was felt that no experienced person in the age group of 50/55 years and having an administrative experience of over 15 years as per the advertisement, would prefer to even apply foregoing the benefits accrued in the previous government service. For important sensitive posts like that of Registrar and Controller of Examinations, we need experienced hands for effective governance. Everyone was of unanimous opinion that Central Civil Service Rules applicable to Central University of Punjab provide contributions towards pension and leave to people coming from government jobs. It was felt that the ordinance of some other central universities explicitly cover this aspect while in case of CUPB, it is implicit.

It is therefore realized that there is no reason to amend the ordinances, which otherwise be very time consuming task. Under this situation, there is no requirement of amendments, if need be, the matter be again brought to the EC for discussion.

During discussion the EC members unanimously suggested to the VC to withdraw this item and let the candidates join their respective posts, and after that the case may be represented to MHRD.

RESOLVE

After detailed deliberations, the Chairman withdrew this item, as there is no need for amendment in the ordinances. It was **RESOLVED** to authorize the Vice Chancellor to take the executive decision. It was also decided that after the incumbents join the university, their representation be sent to MHRD for concurrence of the executive decision.


Before joining, both the incumbent officers, coming from central and state government services, had requested the university to contribute towards leave salary and pension contribution to their parent organizations.


