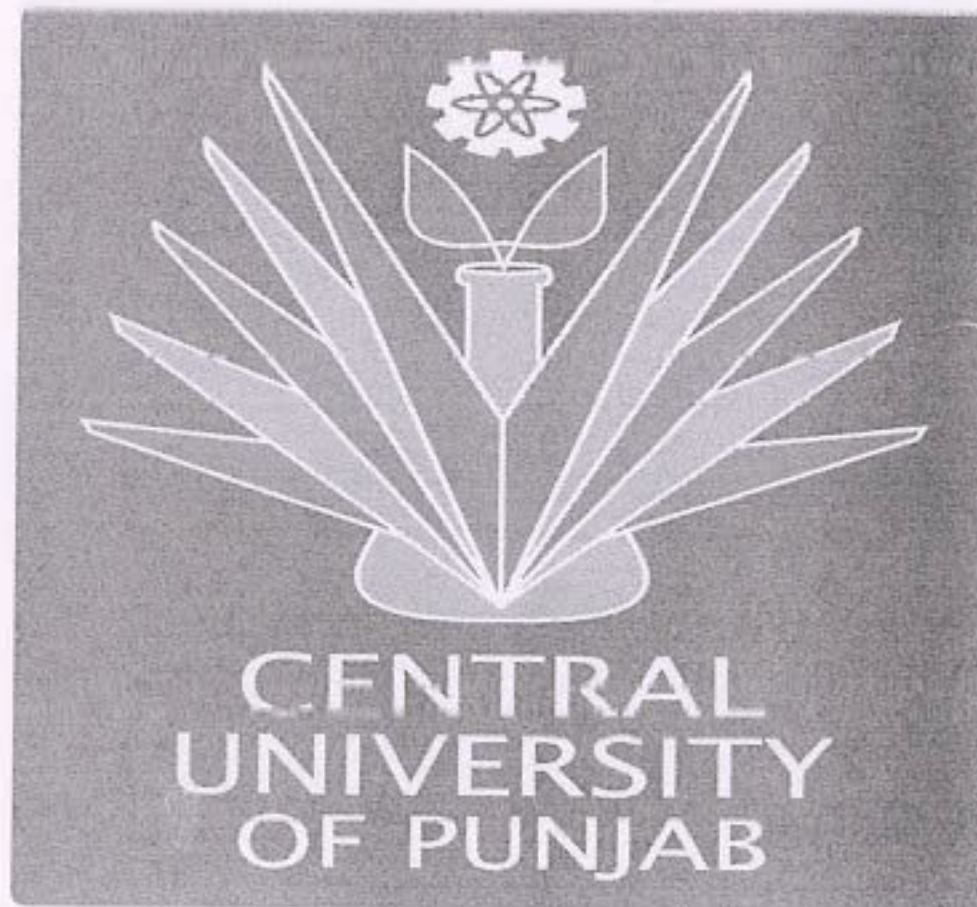

Welcome Note of the Vice Chancellor

The Chairman welcomed the members of the Finance Committee and thanked them for sparing their valuable time from their busy schedule to help the university in taking appropriate decisions. All the members of the Committee were introduced before discussing the agenda.

It was brought to the notice that some portion of the agenda was discussed in the meeting held in ICSSR, Panjab University, Chandigarh on 24.05.2015. Because of the reason that the nominees of the members from UGC and MHRD and Finance could not attend, the meeting was adjourned. The Chairman proposed that the whole agenda, if desired by the members could be discussed again. It was agreed to.

Matter emerged out of discussion:

During the initial discussion, it emerged that the Registrar and Controller of Examinations have been selected by the university. In response to their appointment letters, being in government service (Central and state of Punjab respectively) and the appointment for a period of 5 years, they demanded the university to contribute their leave and pension amount to their parent organization as per the deputation rules.

It was **RESOLVED** to recommend to Executive Council to pay all the benefits of the Registrar and Controller of Examination permitted under deputation rules.

It was **FURTHER RESOLVED** that the post of Finance Officer be re-advertised and recommendations of the Selection Committee be forwarded to the Visitor for approval.

It was suggested by one of the members that the Financial Advisor, MHRD must be informed about the meeting well in advance and the same may be confirmed telephonically.

The Secretary presented the item.

The Chairman brought to the notice that keeping in view the price hike, the university proposes to increase 10% fee in various programmes as per the previous practice.

After a detailed discussion, the Committee **RESOLVED** to recommend the proposed fee structure as per **Annexure - III** for approval of the Executive Council. This will be applicable to the new admissions and not to the existing students of the university.

It was **FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Committee that in addition to the medical fee of Rs. 310 per annum, medical insurance as per actual be charged from student.

To consider the conversion of vacant post of AR/DR to a post of Purchase Officer.

The Secretary presented the item.

The Chairman conveyed that university is in dire need of the Purchase Officer and it proposed to get a post of Purchase Officer sanctioned from the UGC.

After discussion, it was **RESOLVED** to authorize the Vice Chancellor to assign the additional charge of Purchase Officer to any faculty member or senior staff instead of creating a post for the same. The additional charge of Purchase Officer may be assigned to more than one officer as per the requirement of work.

To consider and approve the minutes of 19th meeting of the Sub-Committee of Building Advisory Committee held on 18th April 2015.

While presenting the item, the Secretary desired that the item Nos. FC:9:15:6 to FC:9:15:10 related to the construction of New Campus of the CUPB and the minutes of meetings of Sub-Committees of Building Advisory Committee be taken together because of their interlinkings.

Initiating discussions, the Chairman brought to the notice the details of the technical reason of delay in start of construction by Engineer India Limited (EIL), Project Management Consultant (PMC) of the university.

To take stock of the reasons and status of the issue, senior officers in-charge of the project of EIL (Er. Nalin Kant, GM-Projects, and Mr. Sunil Dahiya) were invited to the meeting.

The officers of EIL shared the technicalities that forced them to annul the earlier process of tendering and issue of fresh tenders. They further clarified with respect to the subject firm (L1 bidder), M/s Universal Contractors and Engineers Pvt. Ltd. have submitted false Completion Certificate, concerned Department in EIL had initiated necessary action and it was finally decided to put the agency on "Negative List" of EIL Data Bank of Construction Contractors and the decision to annul the tender was taken after approval by Competent Authority in EIL looking into all legal aspects. They showed new Notice Inviting Tenders that appeared in Hindustan Times, Times of India, Jagbani etc.

After detailed deliberations, it was **RESOLVED** to instruct EIL to expedite the process of construction, to which they promised. The representatives of EIL submitted the target schedule as per Annexure-IV for tendering activities; vide which the technicalities and formalities needed for awarding the tender will be completed by 20.07.2015.

The Chairman shared with the members the scheme for grant of financial assistance to students, wherein Rupees 64,81,000/- is available in the students aid fund of the university and 115 applications have been received from students belonging to different Centres of the university for receiving assistance from this fund during 2014-15. It was proposed by him that nearly 10% of total amount (Rs. 6,00,000/-) may be distributed among the deserving applicants as per the guidelines attached at **Annexure-IX**.

To consider the fee structure for International students admitted to PG/Ph.D. Programmes of Central University of Punjab, Bathinda.

The Secretary proposed the fee structure for the International students admitted to PG/Ph.D. Programmes of CUPB as given below:

Masters programmes in Humanities:	USD 1000 per annum
Masters programmes in Sciences:	USD 1200 per annum
Ph.D. programmes:	USD 1400 per annum

- Hostel accommodation furnished with basic facilities is included in the above fee.
- However, International students may seek additional facilities on payment basis.
- There will be 10% cumulative increase in fee every year.
- Students from SAARC countries will be charged fees same as for Indian students.

The above mentioned fee structure for international students was discussed and unanimously **RESOLVED** to recommend to Executive Council as proposed.

To consider the Policy for Centre-wise yearly budget.

budget allocation (as per the budget heads of the UGC) for consideration of the Finance Committee:

- a. University is developing a system to encourage the Centres by giving incentives during the budget allocation.
- b. Any equipment costing more than 10 Lacs will be kept at Common Instrumentation Laboratory of the university. Those less than 10 Lacs could be allocated to the Centre.
- c. Equipment purchased from Extra-mural grants to any Principal Investigator in any Centre will be given access to other researchers from the same or even other Centres also, subject to availability.
- d. Likewise costly chemicals will be placed in a Central Chemical Facility.
- e. The budget allocation will be reciprocal to the time of establishment of the Centre i.e. newer Centres and newer faculty will get more funds as compared to the older ones
- f. Fund allocation will be directly proportional to the research productivity of the Centre, number of students, research scholars and faculty.

The Committee **RESOLVED** to recommend to Executive Council to approve the proposed procedure for Centre-wise yearly budget allocation to strengthen the Centres.

Item No. FC:9:15:18

To consider the students financial assistance fund and education loan facility

The Secretary proposed the policy for Students' Financial Assistance and Education Loan Facility as given in **Annexure-XIII**.

Annexure-XIII

The Chairman stressed on the need of these facilities and fund to help students of weaker economic section to continue with their education with financial support.

After a brief discussion, the committee **RESOLVED** to confirm the proposed policy for Students Financial Assistance and Education Loan Facility and recommended for approval of Executive Council. It was also suggested that the students, who intend to avail of education loan, should be suggested to pay 1% from the income which they will get after completion of their study for needy students of the university. It should be a moral obligation on them. They further suggested to work out the modalities in implementation of the scheme and to check the legal issues, if any.

Item No. FC:9:15:19

To consider sanction of funds from University grants to the Principal, Investigator and

The Chairman brought to the notice of the members that the Principal Investigators in some cases face the difficulty in initiating and continuing their research project because of delay in release of payment by the funding agencies. He suggested that the university may sanction some funds, within the limit of the project grant, as per



reimbursement of the same on receipt of the grant from funding agency.

requirement of the Principal Investigator subject to reimbursement of the same on receipt of grant from the funding agency.

The members observed that it is a need based item, and university should provide funding accordingly. Thus, it was **RESOLVED** to sanction the funds from university grants to the Principal Investigator as proposed.

To consider the proceedings of Meeting of committee constituted to frame guidelines for admission to Ph.D. programme during academic session 2015-16.

Taking up this item, the Secretary informed that the meeting of the committee constituted to frame guidelines for admission to Ph.D. programme during academic session 2015-16 was held on 15-05-2015. The committee unanimously resolved to recommend the following:

1. The admission to Ph.D. programme in various Centres may be made only through **Entrance Test** followed by Interviews.
2. To determine the total no. of seats to be advertised, the admission committee may circulate a proforma to each centre to know the exact number of seats to be filled by the centre.
3. For each supervisor, following may be maximum limit to enroll students for Ph.D. research:

a. Professor	-	8
b. Associate Professor	-	6
c. Assistant Professor	-	6
4. No relaxation in teaching load of the faculty shall be allowed for guiding the students.
5. Preference will be given to those candidates who have been granted fellowship from external agencies. A total of seven university fellowships will be granted each year (Not more than one in a centre, following the roaster). In case of funding from CUPB, continuation of fellowship in each year would be linked to the publication as prescribed by the university.
6. The advertisement for admission to Ph.D. programme may be published in 1st week of June 2015.
7. The tentative date of Entrance Test may be 20th June 2015 and



test may be conducted at city campus of the university at Bathinda.

8. The Entrance Test may preferably be conducted on OMR sheets through university computer centre and result may also be preferably declared on the same day.
9. The interviews may be conducted at school/centre level.
10. Efforts may be made to declare the result on 25th June 2015, in order to start the session in first week of August.

After a brief discussion, it was **RESOLVED** to approve the clause of fellowships for Ph.D. programme by the university and to recommend for further approval of the Executive Council.

To consider the provision of E.P.F. Scheme for contractual employees.

The Chairman apprised the members that the Regional Provident Fund Commissioner vide his letter dated 22.01.2015 emphasized on compliance under the E.P.F. and MP Act, 1952 in respect of contract workers.

After a brief discussion, it was **RESOLVED** to recommend to Executive Council to approve the provision of E.P.F. Scheme for contractual employees as per EPF and MP Act, 1952.

The Secretary proposed to consider increase in the salary of contractual staff employed on consolidated pay. The members did not find to favour on purely technical grounds. As per the policy of the government as far as possible, the work be outsourced through a procedure.

The issue was discussed among the members of the committee and it was **RESOLVED** to appoint the non-teaching staff through outsourcing agency, henceforth. In view of the resolution, it will be the responsibility of the outsourcing agency to increase the salary of staff as per rules.

A meeting with M/S Pradeep Sachdeva Design Associates (PSDA), the Architect Consultant and M/S Engineers India Limited (EIL), the Project Management Consultant for the construction activities at the main campus was held on 27th April, 2015 at the Conference Hall of the university at City Campus, Mansa Road, Bathinda from 11.30 A.M. onwards where the consultant teams briefed the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor on the progress related to the development of main campus.

Item No. 1

Discuss the status of GFC drawings of main Campus.

- A Architect Mr. Pradeep Sachdeva informed the house that structural drawings of 7 out of 9 buildings have been submitted to IIT Delhi for review out of which 3 building drawings have been approved by IIT. However PSDA was advised to furnish the comments given by IIT on the structural drawings. Comments of IIT Delhi are yet to be shared with EIL. PSDA was asked to do it.

EIL informed that the structural drawings of VIP Guest House have been reviewed by EIL-Structural team in a meeting on 23.02.2015 at EIL-Gurgaon office with PSDA and their Structural Consultants to discuss the same. EIL pointed out that these comments are applicable for other buildings also. Further, EIL pointed out that only foundation and column drawings have been submitted to EIL for review and details of slab and beam reinforcements are yet to be submitted by PSDA.

CUPB advised PSDA/ EIL to expedite finalization of all drawings at the earliest so that there is no slippage in works at site.

PSDA agreed to give resolution to all EIL comments along with revised drawings by 01.05.2015.

CUPB advised EIL that EIL must prepare the list of drawing and after that approved by the Client.

It was also discussed in the meeting that Building Advisory Committee will not look after the Good For Construction drawings but Committee just looks

the major changes in financial aspects and final payment of the firms. However, a copy of each of such drawings must be submitted to CUPB for its records and use if need be.

B. Schedule of Drawings

CUPB requested PSDA to submit schedule of drawings for Phase-1A works for better monitoring of the project. PSDA informed that list of drawings for Phase-1A works has already been submitted on 24.04.2015 to EIL/ CUPB. EIL pointed out that only list of drawings is submitted and advised PSDA to submit drawing release dates and signature of the Architect so that the same can be monitored. EIL further pointed out that drawings like Finishing Schedule, Flooring Plans, lintel/ sill/ counter drawings, water supply, drainage, sewerage, SLD, power layout, gas piping details etc. have not been indicated in the list furnished by PSDA. PSDA agreed to review the list of drawings and submit the complete schedule of drawings by 30.04.2015. PSDA was asked to give number to each drawing for easy identification and proper record and also sign all drawings (Approved Template from Architect).

C. NOC from Air Force:

CUPB informed that NOC from Air Force has been obtained on 08.04.2015. EIL/ PSDA requested to furnish a copy of the same for records.

D. Consent to Establish from PPCB:

It was noted that the application for Consent to Establish is yet to be submitted by PSDA. Subsequently, the draft application prepared by PSDA was reviewed and signed/ stamped by Competent Authority of CUPB and handed over to PSDA so that it is submitted at the earliest. PSDA/EIL will follow up with feedback to CUPB.

E. GRIHA:

EIL/ CUPB expressed concern over delay in approval of GRIHA Master Plan by PSDA. PSDA informed that they have finalized GRIHA Consultant and required documents for finalization of GRIHA have been submitted to them. PSDA informed that they would be sending the details of the Consultant appointed by 30.04.2015 and assured that all GRIHA approvals and compliances shall be provided within 4 weeks to 6 weeks. As certain things are to be taken care of during construction, therefore action is must now.

F. Walkthrough:

PSDA presented a draft Walkthrough of a few minutes. It was not perfectly 3D and full university was not shown in 3D. However, the efforts was appreciated.

G. Review of Design Basis:

CUPB informed that they would be reviewing HVAC, Drainage, Water Supply, Façade Finish and Parking details. PSDA shall present the approved schemes in meeting tentatively to be held on 31.05.2015 at Bathinda.

Item No. 2

Discussion regarding the deferred buildings (Approval of BAC enclosed, Item No. BAC22:2015:2B.)

Scope of Work for Phase-1B

Conceptual plans of buildings deferred from the Scope of Phase-1A works was discussed. After detailed deliberation on the same, CUPB advised PSDA to furnish the Conceptual Plans for the following buildings under Phase-1B works.

- (i) VC Office
- (ii) VC Residence
- (iii) Administrative Block
- (iv) Transit Hostel
- (v) Library (The area of the library was fixed at 4500 Sq. Mtr.)
- (vi) Triple Seater Hostel – Men
- (vii) Triple Seater Hostel – Women
- (viii) Staff Housing Type-D

Alteration required in conceptual plan of VC Office and VC residence was discussed and is as followed:

VC residence,

- 1. The home office is accessible from outside.
- 2. Two bed rooms to be interconnecting.
- 3. Puja room is to be included in the drawing.
- 4. Explore option without a courtyard.
- 5. Store is to be near to the bed room.

VC office:

- 1. No Jali Concept.
- 2. Relocate the locations of plants in front of the office.
- 3. Re look into the VIP drop off point.
- 4. PA's room to be outside the VC's office.
- 5. No central atrium is required.
- 6. Washroom to be provided near to the meeting rooms
- 7. Hot running water channel,
- 8. HVAC in the building to be modular.
- 9. It is also discussed in the meeting that rotates the building 90°.

PSDA agreed to submit Conceptual Plans of the fore-mentioned buildings so that the same can be discussed during meeting 31.05.2015 and also assured that there will not be any delay on any account and full co-operation will be extended to EIL/CUPB for early completion of the project.

Prof. R. K. Kohli, Vice Chancellor (Chairman) welcomed the Hon'ble members of the Committee to the meeting of Building Advisory Committee (BAC). He thanked all the members for sparing their valuable time from their busy schedule to participate in the meeting and help the University in taking appropriate decisions on important matter relating to main campus development.

To confirm the minutes of 22nd meeting of BAC held on 20-04-2015: M/s. EIL could not adhere to the commitment of placing LOI to L1 on 21-04-2015. Building Advisory took strict view of it.

Item No. BAC:23:2015:1 To discuss regarding latest development in allotment of work to L1 firm i.e. M/s. Universal Contractors & Engineers Pvt. Ltd., Greater Noida.

Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Central University of Punjab, Bathinda informed the sequence of events right from engaging EIL as PMC upto calling tenders for main campus. M/s. EIL - the PMC were given all the input by CUPB in December, 2014 and with slight changes, the NIT cleared for floating of tenders in middle of January, 2015. EIL floated tenders in February 2015, with last date of receiving of tenders as 05-03-2015. At every step EIL had been informed that due to urgency of new campus, time frame is very important. After pre bid conference on 19-02-2015 the technical bid was opened on 05-03-2015 but it was surprising to note that EIL took it casually and it took 25 days to

complete paper formalities for opening of price bids. After follow up, it was informed by EIL that all three tenderers were qualifying technically and were O.K. in working. The price bids were opened in the presence of representatives of 3 bidders on 01-04-2015 and L1 was M/s. VRC constructions (India) Pvt. Ltd. while L2 M/s. Universal Engineers and contractors and the highest rates were of M/s. B.L. Kashyap & Sons Ltd.. The reverse auctioning was fixed on 06-04-2015. In reverse auctioning all the three bidders were present online but M/s. B.L. Kashyap did not bid. However on completion of reverse bidding M/s. Universal Contractor & Engineers became L1 with +3.35% rates which were almost 6.1 crores less than the tendered rates.

On 10-04-2015 M/s. EIL informed that consent to place order be conveyed on L1 M/s. Universal Contractors & Engineers by 21-04-2015 as only 15 days time is allowed by CRC after reverse auctioning.

Central University of Punjab called an emergency meeting of BAC on 20-04-2015 and handed over the consent letter in the evening to EIL so that LOI is placed on L1 firm M/s. Universal Contractors & Engineers on 21-04-2015.

Almost daily it was enquired on telephone from EIL about the work order but EIL did not disclose anything simply saying that certain formalities are being completed and time extension was taken from L1 firm. However on 27-04-2015 it was informed that there is an internal inquiry and their vigilance department had asked for certain records and has asked to hold issuing of work order. It was further informed that there is every likelihood of getting the clearance by Friday i.e. 01-05-2015. But there was no response from EIL on 01-05-2015 and again it was promised on 02-05-2015 that by 04-05-2015 definitely the case will be decided.

Suddenly on 11-05-2015 on telephone it was informed to Vice Chancellor, University Engineering Consultant and Executive Engineer that the work order cannot be placed on L1 Universal Contractor &

Engineer because it has submitted some fake documents in some other tender and the firm cannot be given this order. It was repeatedly asked by CUPB on telephone to give detailed reasons but nothing came out from EIL. On 12-05-2015 it was decided to call EIL in BAC meeting and another emergency BAC meeting was called on 14-05-2015 at Mohali for the convenience of members of BAC and EIL. M/s. EIL was asked to bring all records and details of this tender for reference of BAC in the meeting of 14-05-2015.

It was also informed to the house that the date of visit of VVIP on foundation stone laying ceremony were planned a few times but it did not materialize because of delay in placing the work order for the construction works and M/s. EIL has not stuck to the time frame after technical bid opening upto allotment of work on 21-04-2015 and CUPB was kept in dark for all developments holding the work order.

The house took a strict note that EIL has not fulfilled its commitments. CUPB called a meeting on 20-04-2015 but EIL had taken extension of 15 days from LI for validity and CUPB was not taken into confidence. Moreover no approval from CUPB was taken instead it was informed about 2nd extension of 15 days from LI only in the meeting. On one side EIL was getting extension whereas on the other side proceeding against the firm for having submitted fake documents in some other tender. Also it came out in the meeting that EIL was getting some works executed from the same firm. The reasons could not be explained by GM Mr. Nalin Kant. Also the reasons of not linking up the case of submission of fake documents in other tender with this tender at the time of allocation of work of CUPB could not be satisfactorily answered by GM Er. Nalin Kant of EIL but he apologized in writing for having failed in getting through this tender.

Mr. Nalin Kant GM of EIL agreed that the above statement of CUPB is true. Although EIL has been working hard to achieve the targets but it has failed to materialise and finalize this work order. There has been a failure on EIL part. Mr. Kant also informed that there is a complaint

against this LI firm M/s. Universal Contractors & Engineers and vigilance has established that some documents submitted by this firm M/s. Universal Contractor & Engineer were fake in some other tender and as such it is fraud case and work cannot be awarded to this firm. However admitted that this firm has other works with EIL under his charge going on smoothly. He apologized in writing for the omissions in scrutinizing the record properly.

In view of the above developments the Building Advisory Committee deliberated on the issue of proceeding ahead with work and it discussed following options;

1. To withdraw work from EIL.
2. To give this work to B&R.
3. To give work to CPWD.
4. To make two/three packages and get the work is executed through EIL.

If the work is withdrawn from EIL, CUPB will have to go through a lengthy process of cancellation of agreement and get return of the advance deposits with EIL. EIL understands the work better and all things will be difficult to link up for the new agency. Moreover the case can hang for longtime thus delaying the work due to certain complications.

B&R also is informed of not having proper staff and on this account, being a department of Govt. of Punjab, it will be difficult to have control over them. Er. Daljeet Singh Executive Engineer who is on deputation from B&R Punjab with CUPB also endorsed this view.

CPWD is also not performing well on the construction of road in campus as deposit work.

Therefore CUPB is left with no option but to agree with EIL. As one tender takes minimum 2 months, therefore CUPB wasted two months. EIL also agreed to it. EIL was asked to give their time frame for fresh tenders. EIL informed the house its time frame as under.

The work can be of following two sections:

1. Academic block & External Development
2. All other buildings.

With modified pre qualifying criteria if needed for fair competition. The time period for competitors shall be only 18 months.

It was informed that 45 days will be required as under

1. Tender float on 25-05-2015
2. 21 days for bid invite
3. 15 days for techno-commercial evaluation.
4. 3 days for price opening
5. 10 days for award

BAC is of the view that this will save some time and other complications will also be reduced to minimum.

BAC decided that EIL may prepare two sections of tender as committed above and strictly stick to the time frame given above for finalizing this tender.



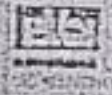

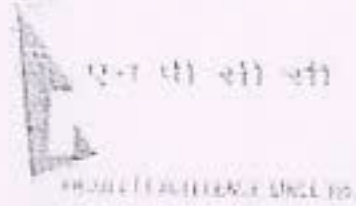

**B. Income and Expenditure Account
Grant/ Subsidies: Rs.1789.69 lakh (Schedule – 13)**

Above does not include Rs. 3564.00 lakh sanctioned on 31 March 2014 for the year 2013-14 towards General Development Assistance to the University and received in the University's bank account in April 2014. As per Accounting Policy adopted by the University (S1. No. 1.6 of Schedule 24), the accounts of the University are being prepared on Accrual basis. Non - account of this grant sanctioned in 2013-14 has resulted in understatement of Income as well as Current Assets, Loans and Advances (Grants receivable).

A grant of Rs.3564 Lacs sanctioned on 31.03.2014 for the year 2013-14 towards General development Assistance has been received in the University bank account in the month of April 2014. The same has been taken into account in the financial year 2014-15 on the basis of actual receipt of Grant-in-aid and at the time of submission of Utilization Certificate to the UGC for the year 2013-14, a separate note has been given that this grant has been received in April 2014. As per the accounting policies reflected in Sr. No.16 of the Schedule – 24 forming part of balance sheet, it is indicating that all revenues from application fee, grant & other receipts are recognised on accrual basis which has already been done in the case of revenue generation i.e. Interest received on grant of the financial year 2013-14 in the balance sheet. As such there is no understatement of Earmarked Endowment as well as Grants Receivable. Keeping in view of the above, the audit para may please be dropped.

No action was required to be taken by the University as the accounting procedure was followed as policies reflected at Sr. No.16 of the Schedule – 24 forming part of the Balance Sheet.

Net impact of Audit comments on the Annual Accounts of Central University of Punjab, Bathinda for the year ending 31 March 2014 is as under:







Students Financial Assistance Fund

1. **Title** – These rules shall be called “The Students’ Financial Assistance Fund”.
2. **Definition** – The following terms shall have the meaning as under:

Fund means the Student Welfare Fund.
Committee means the Committee constituted to administer the Fund.
Vice Chancellor means the Vice Chancellor of Central University of Punjab, Bathinda.
Student means the students admitted to pursue any course in Central University of Punjab, Bathinda.
3. **Aims & Objectives** – Students Financial Assistance Fund has been created with the objective that no deserving student, as far as possible, is denied opportunity of studying at University merely due to her/his poverty.
4. **Administration of Fund** – The Fund shall be administered, managed and monitored by a committee which shall include a nominee of student community. The tenure of the Committee shall be two year.
5. **Sources of Income** – The following shall be the income sources of the Fund:
 - The existing amount in the Student Aid Fund will be put in a corpus fund and interest used under this scheme
 - Library fines collected from students/faculty.
 - Student Aid Fund collected from suppliers/contractors.
 - Donations
 - Any others as deemed fit to be included by Vice Chancellor, CUPB
6. **Eligibility for Grant** – The deserving students with weak economical background will be eligible for grant out of fund subject to the as below conditions. However, the amount of grant or loan will depend upon parents income and family size etc.
 - a) The performance in the qualifying examination should be up to the mark.
 - b) The attendance of the student at Central university of Punjab, Bathinda should be at least 75% and also academic performance atleast “good standing”.
 - c) She/he should have completed the previous semester successfully.
 - d) There should be no disciplinary action or proceedings against the student.
7. **Purpose for which grant can be granted** – The students can avail of the grant for:-

- (a) Pursuing studies: payment of tuition fee/ payment of registration fee
 - (b) Medical treatment: in case of serious illness demanding hospitalization.
 - (c) Attending national international meets, conferences, seminars towards payment of registration fees, 2nd class Train or Bus travel with in India or in specific cases even travel abroad (partial assistance)
 - (d) Any other with the approval of competent authority.
8. **Quantum of Grant** -The amount of the grant shall be up to Rs.40, 000/- depending upon the nature and seriousness of situation.
9. **Eligibility for Loan** – The most deserving students shall be eligible for interest-free loan out of Fund:-
- a) She/he should not have availed of the facility of grant out of the Fund.
 - b) She/he shall submit the guarantee for availing loan out of fund.
 - c) The other conditions as per Rule 6 (a) to (d) shall also be applicable.
10. **Quantum of loan** – The student shall be eligible for loan up to 75% of the total fees payable to Central University of Punjab, Bathinda for the whole program.
11. **Recovery** – The student who wishes to avail of loan under the Financial Assistance Scheme shall execute an affidavit accompanied by Indemnity Bond duly notarized and registered by Notary Public that he/she shall pay back the loan amount before the award of Degree/ DMC.
12. **Procedure to process grant/loan** – The student shall submit her/his application through her/his supervisor duly recommended by the COC/DAA.
13. **Maintenance of Accounts** – Cash book, Receipt Book maintained by an official designated by the Vice Chancellor for the purpose and posting shall be done every month in respect of receipt and payment. For this purpose, a student who has availed facility should offer the services for maintenance and completion of record.
14. **Detailed Accounts** – Detailed accounts of the fund – receipts and expenditure – shall be published annually and shall be available for perusal in the University Library. Contingent expenditure for the maintenance of fund account shall be met from the Fund.
15. **Audit of Accounts** – Annual accounts shall be audited from the auditors appointed by the committee with the consent of the Vice Chancellor. However, half yearly un-audited accounts shall be put up by the Committee to the Vice Chancellor.
16. **Amendment of Constitution** – The amendment to the Constitution shall be made by committee in consultation with the Vice Chancellor.

17. **Investment of Funds** – The committee shall decide how the best returns from the funds can be realized i.e. on long term deposits or depending upon the situation.
18. **Write off the Non-Recoverable Loan** – Sincere efforts shall be made to recover the amount from the loanee. In case, it becomes impossible to recover the amount after exhausting all the remedies, the Vice Chancellor shall be competent to write off the irrecoverable amount of loan on the recommendations of the committee.
19. **Power of Interpretation** – In case of any dispute regarding interpretation of any clause of the fund, the decision of the committee in consultation with the Vice Chancellor shall be final and binding.

EDUCATION LOAN FACILITY TO STUDENTS

Central University of Punjab shall make all efforts to ensure that the financial needs of its students are met. For the present it has tied up with four nationalized banks viz Punjab National Bank, Oriental bank of Commerce, Bank of India and State Bank of India for providing Education loan facility to students. All the Banks shall be having stalls in the premises of the University for the Guidance of students and grant of education loan.

Status Report of construction as on 19-05-2015

A. **Boundary wall of main campus of Central University of Punjab.**

M/s. RITES Ltd. engaged as Project Management Consultancy for boundary wall in January 2011 and work on (approximately 9.5 km.) boundary wall started in August 2011 by M/s. IVRCL under supervision of M/s. RITES and completed in February 2013.

B. **66kv Substation and Tower Lines**

Tower line of 66KV and 66KV Grid Sub Station started in August 2013 as a deposit work by PSPCL and is expected to be completed in July 2015. Construction of 66kv Tower line is completed.

C. **Construction of Entry Road**

The work of Entry road through corridor from Badal-Bathinda Road given as deposit work to CPWD on 29.03.2013 and the work is in full swing. Expected to be completed in August 2015.

D. **Building works on main campus.**

All clearances including environmental clearance have been granted by various departments between August 2014 and January 2015. Consent to Establishment is under process.

M/S. EIL, New Delhi engaged as Project Management Consultant who floated tenders for main building work.

But due to some unavoidable circumstance the tender floated in February 2015 is scraped and will be retendered in few days.
